

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Complete your application online by going to: <https://core.tn.gov> . There are videos to assist in the registration and completion of the application. This will save at least one week from the paper application process.
2. Make sure to select the **Out of State** license type option.
3. Read the online explanations and requirements so you know if you meet the minimum requirements. They are listed on the second page of these instructions.
4. Attach a copy of your Barber School record or diploma, if available.
5. Contact your state board and request that they send us **CERTIFICATION OF YOUR LICENSE**.
****PLEASE NOTE**** If you have been licensed in **more than one state** – please contact each state board that you are/were licensed in and have them send certification. Only one license needs to be current.
6. A non-Refundable application fee must be included to start the reciprocity application process – Please complete the online process by paying the required fifty dollars **\$150.00** at the end of the process.

****Receipt of certifications from other States vary in time so please allow three to four weeks' for processing once you have submitted everything needed per the instructions above.**

7. Once approved for licensure in Tennessee, a license will be mailed to the address you provided. Please make sure to update the board if you have moved. Your license expires every two years and, by statute, you must inform the board of a change of address within 30 days, or update it online yourself.
8. If you do not meet Tennessee's hourly requirements, you may submit proof of the last 5 years work experience in the form of: notarized statement from employer with exact dates of employment and the owner/manager's signature or tax records indicating type of work.

If you do not meet the minimum hourly requirements and cannot provide 5 years work experience immediately prior to your application date, you will be presented to the board at the next available board meeting. You may be required to complete additional hours in order to substantially meet licensure requirements. If the State you were licensed in did not require a State theory and practical exam, you will be required to take one or both.

NOTE: You will be required to produce proof of identification at all times. Make sure your name on the license matches your identification documents.

PROOF OF WORK EXPERIENCE

If your hours of school training were less than 1500 hours for master barber, or 450 instructor hours, follow the instructions below. (You may still qualify for reciprocity) Submit any of the documents listed below:

1. NOTARIZED affidavits.
2. Statements from employers on original letterhead documenting five (5) years of licensed work experience immediately prior to application.
3. Tax preparer, or accountant tax records.
4. Copies of IRS form 1040, w-2 or 1099 forms.
5. Shop licenses dating back five (5) years.

If you do not meet minimum requirement for reciprocal licensure, your application may be deemed necessary to be presented to the Board at the next meeting, visit website listed below for date and times:

TENNESSEE RECIPROCITY REQUIREMENTS

Master Barber	1500 hours (school)
Instructor	1500 barber hours plus 450 hours licensed instructor training

NOTE: Applicants applying for instructor reciprocity must attach proof of at least a 12th grade education or equivalent and proof the applicant has completed and passed a board approved course of instruction of at least 450 hours for instructors.
