

Summary of Correlation of Course Code Document Changes:

Summary of Changes to Elementary Grade Pre-Kindergarten – 8 and Secondary Grades 9-12:

One new academic course has been added to the 2015-16 Correlation of Course Codes document. High school students now receive credit for military basic training. Basic Training has been assigned the course number 3345.

Nineteen courses have been deleted from the business technology and computer technology general education section of the table. All these course were duplicates of courses offered by the Career and Technical Education division. Please reference the Career and Technical Education division of the document to find these courses.

Twenty-eight new teacher licensure endorsements have been added for the 2015-16 school year. Theses endorsements have been added to coursers were appropriate.

Summary of Changes to Special Education:

Modified Course Codes:

Modified course codes may be used to schedule students for special education intervention aligned to their area of deficit as indicated in their IEP.

Endorsements:

The following statement has been added to English, math, and science courses which had previously only included endorsements for appropriately endorsed special education teachers.

*(1) An appropriately endorsed regular education teacher who has been determined to be HQ in *English may serve as the teacher of record for regular education and special education students however someone from the Special Education staff must work with the teacher to support the SWDs in an inclusive setting.*

Special Education Gateway Courses:

These courses were designed for students who entered high school under the Gateway competencies. These course codes will expire the 2016-17 school year.

Changes to Early Postsecondary Courses 9-12:

The 2015-16 Correlation of Course Codes includes a separate section with information specifically on reporting early postsecondary credit opportunities. Specific requirements and course codes are provided for dual enrollment, Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, and Cambridge courses. Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate information have been in the correlation document in previous years, while dual enrollment and Cambridge courses are being included for the first time this year.

Dual enrollment courses have been assigned high school course codes in order to help facilitate course scheduling and accurate reporting. However, it is important to remember that these are postsecondary courses, in which high school students are enrolled at the partnering institution. High School credit is awarded based on local policy. Additionally, the course content and instructors must meet postsecondary requirements, but there are no secondary teacher licensure requirements. A teacher of record will not be required when using one of the dual enrollment course codes.
