
The Paleoamerican Odyssey Conference

I recently had the opportunity to participate in the Paleoamerican Odyssey Conference in Santa Fe, New Mexico. Archaeologists from the Americas, Russia, England and Japan met to discuss the first colonists of the New World. Many of these researchers brought Clovis, Cumberland, Folsom, and other Paleoindian artifacts to the conference to compare/contrast the lithic technologies. This presentation will highlight the artifacts of these early colonists – as seen from across the New World.
