



numbers 9-1-1?

The FCC in November 1967, conferred with the American Telephone & Telegraph Company to see if the creation of such an emergency telephone system was feasible. As a result, in early 1968 AT&T announced that it was establishing the digits 9-1-1 as a nationwide emergency code. These particular digits were selected, first,

because they were easy to remember and dial on the telephone and, secondly, because the number combination had never been authorized as an area code, office code, or service code. Congress moved quickly to enact the 911 emergency code into law, paving the way for the creation of local emergency telephone systems using the three-digit code.






