PROJECT OVERVIEW

The State of Tennessee has a history of leadership in the national 911 community in areas of technology and management. Tennessee is working to continue that legacy of excellence through our training program. The Tennessee Emergency Communication Board (TECB) is focused on offering 911 training initiatives that ensure emergency communications district (ECD) and public safety answering point (PSAP) leadership and telecommunicators have the knowledge, skills and abilities required to improve emergency response outcomes. These training opportunities are made available through both Virtual Academy online training program and in-person classroom offerings.



WHO IS IMPACTED

Governmental PSAPs that take initial or transferred 911 calls can take advantage of the training opportunities offered online or in person.

MENTAL HEALTH AND CRISIS INTERVENTION TRAINING

The TECB is partnered with the National Alliance on Mental Illness, Tennessee (NAMI-TN) to provide free, in-person Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training specific to 9-1-1. CIT dispatcher trainings are designed specifically for the 9-1-1 telecommunicator. During the course, 9-1-1 professionals will learn what CIT is, the roll a 9-1-1 telecommunicator plays in CIT, signs and symptoms of mental illness, and how to more effectively handle calls from mental health consumers.

So far, the CIT dispatch trainings have totaled 512 hours of in-person training for 9-1-1 professionals. These courses are designed to provide public safety telecommunicators with the training to process calls from people suffering mental health crises.

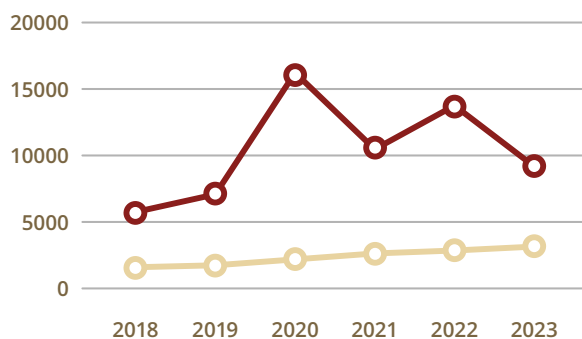
