

## Transitioning Youth to the Employment and Community First (ECF) Choices Program for Adult Services

(Policy 19.8)

## What you need to know:

DCS refers all youth in DCS custody who are approaching adulthood, age 15 and up **and** diagnosed with an intellectual disability (ID) **and/or** developmental disability (DD) to the Employment and Community First (ECF)Choices program for services/supportive housing prior to their mandated release from custody.

## **Important Timeframes to remember:**

- At age 15 and up FSW begins the referral process to determine if the youth qualifies (see section A of policy 19.8)
- At age 17, FSW begins application process for obtaining SSI (see section B of policy 19.8)
- ♦ 6 months prior to youth's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday, FSW submits request for legal assistance to determine conservatorship (see Policy <u>19.10</u>, <u>Designating a Medical Decision Maker for Youth with Disabilities Aging out of DCS Custody</u>)
- ◆ <u>3 months/90 days prior to youth's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday,</u> FSW completes the online referral to the ECF program through the TennCare website, here:

It is important that all of these steps are completed timely so that the youth's transition to adult services does not get delayed.

**Tip:** It may be helpful to create a calendar appointment in Outlook with the identified deadlines listed above to remain off the overdue list.
