

The Tennessee Division of Air Pollution Control (TDAPC) has received requests for construction and/or modification of air contaminant sources as noted below. The proposed construction and/or modification is subject to part 1200-03-09-.01(1)(h) of the Tennessee Air Pollution Control Regulations, which requires a public notification and 30-day public comment period. Interested parties may express their comments and concerns in writing to air.pollution.control@TN.gov or Ms. Michelle W. Owenby, Director, Division of Air Pollution Control, William R. Snodgrass Tennessee Tower, 312 Rosa L. Parks Avenue, 15th Floor, Nashville, Tennessee 37243 within 30 days of the date of this notice. Construction permits issued by TDAPC do not grant any authority to operate, construct, or maintain any installation in violation of any law, statute, code, ordinance, rule, or regulation of the State of Tennessee or any of its political subdivisions.

Individuals with disabilities who wish to participate should contact the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation to discuss any auxiliary aids or services needed to facilitate such participation. The applicant is Luxit Tennessee, LLC with a mailing address of 102 Magneti Marelli Drive, Pulaski, TN 38478. The applicant seeks to obtain an air contaminant permit (Division identification number: 28-0147 and 82079) for the modification at the following address: 102 Magneti Marelli Drive, Pulaski. The permit request is for modification of the following: an increase in headlamp lens throughput and a change in coatings that will result in increased volatile organic compound (VOC) emissions from the existing surface coating operation. The existing headlamp lens surface coating operation consists of two spray coating booths, one air handling unit (AMU) with humidity control, and one natural gas-fired flash-off oven. There would be no physical construction. Regulated air contaminants are emitted by this source. The spray coating booths are equipped with water wash units to reduce particulate matter emissions.
