Notice: As of February 9, Williamson County and the Major Nathaniel Cheairs Camp 2138 of the Sons of Confederate Veterans have been granted a continuance of the hearing on the county's waiver petition by the administrative law judge. As a result of the continuance, the hearing is now set for the commission's regular April meeting pursuant to the judge's order.

There will be no public comments accepted at the February meeting regarding Williamson County's waiver petition. However, time will be set aside for general public comments at the conclusion of regular commission business.

Tenn. Code Ann. § 4-1-412 (c)(6) provides, in part, that: "An interested entity, group, or individual shall be afforded an opportunity to offer public comments regarding a petition for waiver at any commission hearing on a petition."

An interested entity, group, or individual that wishes to provide a <u>written</u> comment on the Williamson County petition for waiver may do so by emailing the comment to: <u>Ask.THC@tn.gov</u>.

An interested entity, group, or individual that wishes to <u>orally</u> comment on the Williamson County petition for waiver must make their request by emailing <u>Ask.THC@tn.gov</u> no later than 5:00 PM, February 15, 2022.

The request to comment must include the name of the interested entity, group, or individual. Requesters wishing to make a verbal comment MUST be physically present or be logged on to the WebEx meeting. If a requester is not physically present or logged on to the WebEx meeting when their name is called, they will forfeit their opportunity to comment. The name of those who have requested to comment verbally will be called in the order that requests were received. When a requester's name is called, and if the requester is participating via WebEx or telephone, the requester's microphone will be unmuted (activated) and the requester will have up to three minutes to speak.
