2013 Lobbyist Registration Audit of Bradley Stevens

FINDINGS

Mr. Bradley Stevens failed to timely register as a lobbyist for his employer (See Registrations section).

EMPLOYER

• Americans for Prosperity

REGISTRATIONS

Mr. Stevens registered as a lobbyist for one employer during 2013. Based on the audit documentation, Mr. Stevens was an employee of Americans for Prosperity with duties that included lobbying during 2013. He was also registered as their lobbyist in 2012, thus the lobbyist had continuing lobbying relationship with his employer. Therefore, the lobbyist should have registered within 7 days of the commencement of the year which is January 8, 2013. Mr. Stevens did not register until February 13, 2013, 36 days late.

LOBBYING AGREEMENTS

Based on a review of the audit documentation provided by Mr. Stevens, he was a direct employee of the employer. The employer had no employment contract with the lobbyist employee. However, per statements of the lobbyist and review of his job description, it appears the terms of employment were within the statutes for lobbying activities including having no terms for contingency payments based on lobbying success.

FAMILY OR BUSINESS ARRANGEMENTS WITH PUBLIC OFFICIALS

Mr. Stevens reported he had no business or familial relationships with persons who were officials in the legislative branch or officials in the executive branch.

TRAINING & FEES

Based on review of the Bureau of Ethics and Campaign Finance's lobbyist records, Mr. Stevens fulfilled his required lobbyist training for the 2013 registration year and paid all registration fees.
