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ECD and TDOT Restricted Funds

- Appendixes 8 and 9 in report provide a report on:
 - ECD Community Development Block grant (CDBG) program
 - \$34.8M funded by US HUD CARES funds
 - Targeting Broadband, First Responder Assistance, Public Services (e.g., food banks, counseling), Main Street Business and Downtown Development, and Public Utility improvements
 - DOT COVID-19 transit relief grant fund
 - For public transit operators, funds all activities normally eligible under US DOT programs including planning, operating, and capital
 - Funded by US DOT CARES funds



Coronavirus Relief Fund - Current

- **Beginning:** \$2.36B for COVID-19 expenses incurred March 1 Dec 30
- Business Relief
 - \$200M to those required to close or who saw significant reduction in taxable sales.
- Unemployment Trust Fund
 - Transferred \$268M. Additional \$131M required for June (Totaling \$400M for FY20).
 - July through December projected to draw down trust fund to \$376 million (Requiring additional \$624M* to remain above \$1 billion balance)

Remaining

- \$1.2B held for potential Congressional action re: revenue replacement.
- Other priorities will need to be balanced against this potential option
- Likelihood of Congressional action to remain unclear through June.



Costs to State Government

Public Health

- COVID-19 Unified Command Group response (Est. \$127M to state)
- Could be reduced as funds are attributed to other funding sources (e.g., FEMA, HHS)

Other Costs

- AWS, implementing COVID-19 leave policy under FFCRA, cleaning. (Est. \$100M to state)
- \$227M estimated need for new cost increases

Health and Safety Payroll

- Updated guidance from Treasury
- This could have significant beneficial fiscal impact to states <u>and</u> local governments.
- State estimated expense won't exceed \$280M



Outlook Ahead

- \$1B *projected* requirement to maintain UI Trust Fund
- \$200M for business relief
- \$1.16B remaining to address:
 - New costs incurred by State Govt (\$227M)
 - Replacement of lost tax revenue (if option provided by Congress)
 - Future priorities, such as:
 - Displacement of budgeted health and safety payroll (\$280M max estimate)
 - Additional business relief to other sectors of economy (non-profit, ag, targeted demographics)
 - Local government support



Potential Additional Stimulus

Agriculture

- Several states providing specific relief for agricultural producers
- USDA also spending funds requiring coordination of effort
- Would reimburse losses or "cost of business interruption" due to reduced consumer demand
- Costs incurred to temporarily increase processing capacity (stabilize food supply) would be eligible

Non-profits

- Some states including non-profits in business relief programs
- Additional guidance needed to confirm what loss could be reimbursable. Treasury describes the "costs of business interruption"
- Not all non-profits fall under state oversight. Would require new administrative processes and decisions on who to include

Diverse Business Enterprises

- Some states partnering or providing some additional technical assistance support
- Others providing a reserve or set-aside of funds distributed for business grants (e.g., Arkansas 15% set-aside).



Potential Additional Stimulus - Local Govt

Known ineligible expenses

- Revenue replacement
- Capital improvements (must be a current response to pandemic)
- Payroll or expenditures not related to COVID-19

Funds could support

- Reimbursement of costs of public health response (e.g., testing, tracing, temporary structures)
- Costs associated with implementing COVID-19-related sick leave or similar policies
- Reimbursement of payroll for health and safety
- Costs incurred to sanitize public spaces or implement health guidelines

• Current City and County Grant program includes COVID-19 but interest low

- Opened in April. \$358,000 of \$24.5 million in requests so far are COVID-related
- F&A survey of Local Governments shows more interest at \$9.4M in reported expenditures (around 13% response rate so far, so expect figure to grow)



CARES Act - Direct Airport Relief

- Full distribution in updated report (Appendix 6)
- \$121M provided by CARES Act to McGhee-Tyson, Tri-Cities, Chattanooga, Nashville, Memphis
- Additional 63 local airports received \$2.5M total
- Unlike Coronavirus Relief Fund, CARES Airport relief may be used for general operations and not limited to COVID-19-related expenses
