

TEMA's Beginning...

- 1951 -- Federal Gov't formed State Civil Defense organizations (Cold War)
 - Tennessee and some local governments built EOC's to bomb proof standards
 - TN State Civil Defense worked with counties to build fallout shelters to protect citizens
- 1960s–Cold War preparedness,
 - Evacuation Planning
 - Fall Out shelter
 - RADEF Training
 - EOC construction












All Hazards planning

- 1970s -- Federal Gov't moved to all hazards planning, mitigation of, preparedness for, response too, recovery from disasters.
 - Federal Emergency Management Agency formed

National – State - Local Plans are based on the same concept and inter-lock for a coordinated, prevention, mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery effort.

State Emergency Operations Center




Staffed by TEMA personnel, State department ESCs and Liaisons from NGO, Pvt. Sector, Federal Government.


State Emergency Operations Structure

Resources typically not available from a State agency or another State partner.

<u>State Watch Point</u>- the State's 24 hour, 365 day a year:

- alert and notification center for emergency incidents, activities, and events.
- coordination point for receiving, assigning, and tracking requests for state resources

State Response & Assistance


- Department ESC reviews resource requests and works solutions
 - Coordinates request within Department
 - Commits Resources
 - Commits Personnel
 - Updates Department Leadership as required
 - Coordinates with other Departments and Agencies as needed
 - Documentation of all disaster activities
- SEOC directed Resources & Assistance
 - Department and Agency resources support local jurisdictions during disaster response operations

EVENT

County Mayor

Via LEMA or EOC

- Other Non-State Resource Providers
 EMAC
 - Federal
 - Volunteer & NGO

MCC Requirements


- Contact name and number
- Specifications or request details
- Ship to or delivery address
- Delivery requirements
 - Physical
 - Timeframe
- Justification
- On going support requirements

Locating Goods or Services

- Supply thru internal sources (Surplus)
- Statewide contracts or Agency Contracts
- Local or Go-DBE suppliers registered in Edison
- Other registered suppliers
- Manufacturers
- Brokers or nonregistered suppliers
