Investigations Report Nichelle Dorroh Presentation/Discussion There were seven (7) new complaints in September which were categorized as unprofessional conduct most of which were related to continuing education violations connected with divisional audit of personnel.

Necessity of Licensure for American Esoteric Laboratory Memphis, TN 38134

Two Sites/ One License

Board members reviewed a request with and by Dr. David Smalley, Company President, relative to the following circumstances:

American Esoteric Laboratory (AEL) licensed and certified laboratory located on ground floor at 80 Humphreys Avenue, Memphis TN.

Boston Baskin Oncology Clinic is located on the $3^{\rm rd}$ floor of the same building.

AEL acquired space within the clinic to receive specimens and utilize a cell counter to analyze Complete Blood Counts (CBC's) on patients scheduled for chemotherapy.

Dr. Smalley requested board review and determination as to the applicability of this adjacent site falling under the umbrella of the currently licensed AEL laboratory on the ground floor with the same CLIA number and state license number.

Discussion revealed the previous laboratory at the 3rd floor site had its own CLIA number and was licensed by the state. When operations ceased, these files were closed via notification to state and federal licensure/certification agencies.

An on-site survey performed in April 2015, determined the necessity of licensure because of location in the Oncology Clinic, physician's office arena. Discussion also revealed the laboratory performed tests not only for the single physician's office but for other physician offices located throughout the building, and at time overflow testing from the main laboratory on the ground floor.

The 3rd floor laboratory currently is operating without a CLIA number and state license because clarification of previously submitted documentation to the CLIA office appears to be confusing to all participants associated with certification and licensure.

Discussion between CLIA representatives and state counsel determined additional information must be submitted to Atlanta with subsequent determination as to the necessity of a separate CLIA number for the laboratory on the 3rd floor.

State counsel suggested the board table this request until further documentation could be presented for board interpretation of their regulations concerning state licensure.

<u>Motion</u>: To Table On Recommendation of Counsel No further action taken at this time.

Discuss Quality Control Measures CLIA/IQCP State Regulations QC 1200-06-03-09 Board members, staff, surveyors and recognized members of the audience discussed the implementation of IQCP to be implemented by CLIA (Clinical Laboratory Improvements Act) on January 01, 2016 for all laboratories relative to individualized quality control measures (IQCP).

Under CLIA, IQCP is optional and it could be recommended that state regulations could be optional too.

If a lab does not choose to voluntarily it would refer to regular CLIA regulations.

Each laboratory determines its own individualization and Implementation of their own quality control plan.

The uniformity lies with standardization of calibration and verification of instruments utilized in that specific laboratory.

It was suggested that surveyors make recommendations for board review at a future date to assess where the state rules could be amended without dilution of the intent of the state's regulations.

Counsel suggested the formulation of a policy to be utilized until the determination of and if a regulatory change in state rules could be accessed.

Consider Rule Making for 1200-06-01-.1(22) and 1200-06-03-.08(d) (5) relative to pathologists reading slides/location of diagnosis. The delay caused by a lack of staff to afford maximum time and effort toward the discussion and dissemination of materials necessary for a complete review.
