## BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR NURSING HOME ADMINISTRATORS CRIMINAL CONVICTION POLICY

Any person who has applied for a license, renewal or reinstatement who has a felony conviction which occurred ten (10) or more years prior to the date of application for licensure; or a single misdemeanor conviction or group of misdemeanor convictions all arising out of a single incident which occurred five (5) or more years prior to the date of application for licensure need not appear personally before the Board for the sole reason of a criminal conviction.

The following are required to appear before the Board before any license, reinstatement, renewal or practice authorization may be issued:

- 1. Any applicant who has a felony conviction which occurred less than ten (10) years from the date of application for licensure; or
- 2. Any applicant who has a single misdemeanor conviction or group of misdemeanor convictions all arising out of a single incident which occurred less than five (5) years from the date of application for licensure; or
- 3. Any applicant who has more than one felony conviction regardless of when they occurred; or
- 4. Any applicant who has a pattern of multiple misdemeanor convictions not arising out of a single incident regardless of when they occurred.
