

TN Health Alert Network Communication Update on COVID-19 Vaccine Booster September 9, 2022

Thank you for your continued support in making COVID-19 information and vaccine accessible to Tennesseans. On August 31, 2022, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) authorized both Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech bivalent COVID-19 boosters. On September 1, 2022, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) endorsed the CDC Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommendation for use of the updated bivalent COVID-19 booster.

The updated COVID-19 "bivalent" vaccines increase protection against the currently circulating variants by adding protection against these strains of the virus to the original strain in the COVID-19 "monovalent" vaccines. These vaccines are safe and effective.

- The following individuals are eligible for a single booster dose of **either the Moderna COVID-19**Vaccine, Bivalent OR the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine, Bivalent:
 - o Are 18 years of age and older
 - Completed primary vaccination or have received the most recent booster dose with any authorized or approved monovalent COVID-19 vaccine at least two months prior
- The following individuals are eligible for a single booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19
 Vaccine, Bivalent:
 - Are 12 years of age and older
 - Completed primary vaccination or have received the most recent booster dose with any authorized or approved monovalent COVID-19 vaccine at least two months prior

Please be aware that the Pfizer monovalent and bivalent boosters both have a gray cap and gray border on the vial. The only difference is the writing on the vial indicating "Bivalent" vaccine (pictured below).

TDH wants to emphasize an important change resulting from the FDA approval. As of Thursday, August 31, 2022, monovalent mRNA COVID-19 vaccines are NO LONGER authorized for use as boosters in people ages 12 years and older.

- With this week's authorization, the monovalent mRNA COVID-19 vaccines are not authorized as booster doses for individuals 12 years of age and older.
- Appointments for monovalent Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna boosters in people 12 years of age and older must be rescheduled for when locations have the bivalent COVID-19 vaccines available.

Tennessee COVID-19 vaccine providers will begin receiving the updated booster vaccines next week. Please communicate with your patients as appropriate to notify them about receipt and availability of new vaccine boosters.
