PORTER CONFERENCE ROOM- Ellington Ag Center Topics for One Health Meeting

Virulent Newcastle Disease Presentation – Keren Rozensher, USDA Veterinary Services
 RNA virus, 3 virulent groups-250 species of birds affected.

Respiratory, nervous and digestive signs. Highly contagious- poultry are the most susceptible, waterfowl the least.

First case was in an imported parrot in California in the 1970s. 2002-2003 outbreak was in southern California and Arizona. 2018 outbreak in southern California is mostly in backyard flocks of chickens, turkeys and pigeons. Virulent ND was diagnosed in a live bird market last week; this was the first report to OIE.

Daily SPRS: Surveillance, preparedness and response (test, euthanasia and disposal). CO2 being used for euthanasia (CO2 & Max trucks-holds up to 400 birds.) Safety has been an issue because of 110 degree heat and the teams being in PPE (TYVEK). Indemnity is being paid for positive and dangerous premise birds. Low Public Health concern, ND can cause mild flu like symptoms in humans.

- 2. Virulent Newcastle Disease USDA Wildlife Services response. J.D. Freye, USDA Wildlife Services. Wildlife Services participated on the depop teams in California. 30 VS Wildlife Biologists are doing 3 week rotations. Six team members participate as sharpshooters in close quarters. The teams were used to depop feral birds using pellet and suppressed 22 rifles.
