Commercial Vehicle Operators & Legionella



Legionella are bacteria that can cause a serious lung infection called Legionnaires' disease. Legionella grow naturally in water and can also be found in human-made water sources. People can become infected with Legionella when they inhale water droplets that contain the bacteria.



Windshield wiper reservoirs

are not a common source of *Legionella* bacteria. However, if water is used in place of windshield wiper fluid to fill the reservoir, *Legionella* may grow and spread through the windshield washer nozzle. As a commercial vehicle operator, you may have a higher chance of getting Legionnaires' disease.

Decrease your risk by following these three simple steps:

- **Solution** Only use full-strength windshield wiper fluid in your truck's windshield wiper fluid tank
- **Ensure wiper fluid has anti-freeze or similar chemical**
- **✓ Close the cab windows while cleaning your windshield**



The number of people with Legionnaire's disease in Tennessee and in the United States has increased since 2000. Between 2018-2022, **785 people in Tennessee** were diagnosed with **Legionnaires' disease** and **25 of those cases were self-described commercial truck operators** during the time they could have become infected.
