POLICY STATEMENT REGARDING SUPERVISION FOR CLINICAL PASTORAL THERAPIST APPLICANTS

The Board for Professional Counselors, Marital and Family Therapists, and Clinical Pastoral Therapists ("The Board") adopts the following statement as clarification on the "board-approved supervisors" required pursuant to T.C.A. § 63-22-203(4):

A "board-approved supervisor" for a clinical pastoral therapy applicant shall include the following licensed mental health professionals who meet their disciplines' criteria for approved supervision:

- 1. Licensed Marital and Family Therapist (LMFT);
- 2. Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW);
- 3. Licensed Professional Counselor/Mental Health Service Provider (LPC/MHSP);
- 4. Licensed Clinical Pastoral Therapist (CPT);
- 5. Psychologist;
- 6. Psychiatrist;
- 7. Certified Psychoanalysts; or
- 8. Psychotherapist Members of ACPE who joined the organization prior to January 2021.

A minimum of ninety (90) hours must be under the supervision of a Licensed Clinical Pastoral Therapist supervisor.

Reason for Policy Statement: Amendment to T.C.A. § 63-22-203(4), expanded the definition of approved CPT supervisor to "board-approved" supervisor.
