Discuss the Definition of Lab Surveillance Testing

After discussion, the Board adopted the CDC definition of surveillance testing which reads:

"Public health surveillance is intended to monitor population-level burden of disease, or to characterize the incidence and prevalence of disease. Surveillance testing is primarily used to gain information at a population level, rather than an individual level. Surveillance testing results are not reported back to the individual. As such, surveillance testing cannot be used, for an individual's health care decision making or individual public health actions such as isolation or quarantine."

Governor Lee's Executive Order 77 & 80 were reviewed by the Board.

HCA Healthcare proposed a Free Standing Emergency Department (FSED)model in which nursing staff performs moderately complex testing. They are proposing not to have a medical technologist or laboratory supervisor present when testing is being performed.

At this point, HCA Healthcare does not have three (3) months of laboratory data. They are developing a plan about the set-up and the diagnostic testing which they would like to share with the Board at their next meeting in July.

The Board requested that they complete an exemption packet and define where within the facility testing will occur.

Also, a request was made for a legal opinion regarding if the Board has the authority to grant an exemption to personnel performing testing within a FSED.
