agency AATB was not on the list of board approved  
certifying agencies. The American Association of  
Bioanalysts (AAB) is the only agency approved by the TMLB  
for the specialty of Embryology. She was also requesting  
licensure based on thirty years of experience in the field of

Embryology. She would have been a possible backup to the embryologist at Regional One Health in Memphis.

After reviewing the documentation presented, the P&E Committee members did not feel that there was enough information about the AATB to grant the license as a Special Analyst – Embryology under Rule 1200-06-01-.22 (1) (e) (1). They invited Ms. Stringfellow to come to the July 19, 2018 meeting to further explain the AATB certification.

The second route presented for possible licensure was by using her thirty years of experience as described in Rule 1200-06-01-.22 (1) (e) (2). The P&E Committee members acknowledged her vast experience, but thought she should take the American Association of Bioanalysts (AAB) in Embryology, since it is available.

**Anami Patel, PhD, MB(ASCP)<sup>CM</sup>, DLM<sup>CM</sup>** appeared before the Personnel and Education Committee for approval to become the initial Program Director of the Poplar Healthcare, Special Analyst in Molecular Diagnostics Training Program in Memphis, TN.

The Committee interviewed Dr. Patel and reviewed his qualifications in relationship with the Rule 1200-06-02-.07 (1)(a) (2). Dr. Patel had the qualifications to be the program director, however he had not made the initial contact to become approved as a Program Director with NAACLS .

After gaining conditional approval as the program director, **Anami Patel, PhD, MB(ASCP)<sup>CM</sup>, DLM<sup>CM</sup>** requested approval of the application for the Special Analyst in Molecular Diagnostics Training Program at Poplar Healthcare, Memphis, TN.

The P&E Committee reviewed the application and the Laboratory Board Training Program Standards Checklist



that was completed on March 27, 2018 at the site visit conducted by Karon Hathcoat, West TN Regional Consultant/ Surveyor:

- I. Facility, Equipment, Materials (Rule 1200-06-02-.01)
- II. Faculty Requirements (Rule 1200-06-02-.02)
- III. Minimum Requirements for Special Analyst programs (Rule 1200-06-02-.07)
- VI. Contents of Application for Admission to Training Programs (Rule 1200-06-02-.06)
- VII. Clinical Facilities/Approved Laboratory Experience-Practicum (Rule 1200-06-02-.01(5))

Dr. Patel and Dr. James A. Allay, Vice President, Quality Assurance Chief Compliance Officer, were interviewed by the P&E Committee members. They had not contacted NAACLS for the program's accreditation. They had not submitted a course syllabus for the didactic instruction in Molecular Diagnostics or a rotation schedule for the clinical practicum.

**Karen Reiner, PhD, MT (ASCP)**, Program Director of Andrews University MLS Training Program, Berrien Springs, MI , sent an email requesting the Tennessee Medical Laboratory Board's acceptance of the Andrews University course, MLSC 230 Fundamentals of Clinical Microbiology to fulfill the microbiology course requirements of Rule 1200-06-01-.22(1)(g).

Dr. Reiner said that the prior program director, Dr. Marcia Kilsby, had an agreement with the TN Medical Laboratory Board to accept MLSC 230 Fundamentals of Clinical Microbiology to fulfill the microbiology course requirements.

In addition, she requested that the committee members upgrade the applications of four Andrews University graduates to the Medical Laboratory Technologist category. These four graduates lacked the required microbiology course and their applications had been downgraded to the Medical Laboratory Technician category.

The following documents were presented to the committee members:

- Syllabus of MLSC 230 Fundamentals of Clinical Microbiology from Andrews University
- Program description and requirements for the Andrews University MLS Program
- Archived course requirements for a MLS degree from Southern Adventist University, Collegedale, TN for the years 2011 through 2017
- The transcripts of the four students to whom Dr. Reiner was requesting a upgrade from MLT to MT
- Six archived transcripts of students that received a MT license during the 2011-2014 tenure of Dr. Marcia Kilsby at Andrews University

The TMLB staff could not find any evidence of an agreement with, Dr. Kilsby, the prior director of the Andrews University MLS training program. However, upon examination of the six archived transcripts, the staff discovered that the feeder university, Southern Adventist, had changed the prerequisite course requirements for the MLS students who would attend Andrews University for their MLS training. SAU stopped requiring Microbiology as a prerequisite in 2012. The four students in question did not take Microbiology course because it was not a requirement of the MLS major at SAU.

After the review of the presented documents, the

members of the P&E Committee voted to deny the requests from Dr. Reiner. All applicants must have the same requirements whether they are in-state or out-of-state applicants. Until the Rules are revised, exceptions cannot be made. All Tennessee training programs require that the MT students have 16 semester hours of chemistry and 16 semester hours of biology prior to attending the MT (MLS) training programs.

The Committee thought it would be beneficial to the students of the Andrews University MLS Training Program to be informed of the Tennessee licensure course requirements before they graduate; especially if the students are planning to work in Tennessee. The members also recommended that the four applicants could take an online TN Ecourse-General Microbiology, to be upgraded to technologist.

**Ms. Walton made the motion** that as the rule was currently written, the MLSC 230 Fundamentals of Clinical Microbiology of the Andrews University MLS Program did not meet the requirements of the Tennessee rules 1200-06-01-.22(1) (g). The four applicants would not be upgraded to the technologist level.
