The CSMD was established in 2006. Having an independent portal is a barrier to use. It's important to have equivalent functionality in the new, integrated portal as in the CSMD. The proposal is to integrate the CSMD with clinical risk indicators into the Electronic Health Record with the pharmacy system beginning early in 2019 for a seamless user experience. Initial "jump start" funding will be provided by TDH boards. Mr. Young moved to fund the BON share from its surplus for year 1 and 2 along with other TDH boards.
