## Medication Aide Training Programs

- 5 programs approved in 2021, for a total of 9 approved programs
- 25 Certified Medication Aides at this time last year
- 58 Certified Medication Aides currently




### **Practical Nursing Programs**

- 25 approved programs
- 21 schools on FULL approval; however, 3 programs appearing today
- 0 programs 100% NCLEX first time pass rate
- 6 programs letter of concern
- 6 programs will submit a progress report in August
- No programs have national nursing accreditation; all TCAT's have national accreditation through the Council on Occupational Education.
- Average TN NCLEX pass rate 86.1% National 79.6%
- Tennessee PN programs rank 23<sup>rd</sup>
   (1,314 tests with 1,131 passing on 1<sup>st</sup> attempt)

# **Professional Nursing Programs**

- 99 approved schools:
  - 21 Associate Degree
  - 61 BSN initial licensure (includes RN to BSN)
  - 29 RN to BSN only
  - 65 graduate (44 offering Doctoral Degrees)
- 2 schools appearing for hearings
- 2 programs 100% NCLEX first time pass rate
- 13 programs letter of concern
- 13 programs will submit a progress report in August
- 0 programs closed in 2021
- Average TN NCLEX pass rate 87.65% National 82.48%
- Tennessee programs rank 13<sup>th</sup> (4,114 tests with 3606 passing 1<sup>st</sup> attempt)




# **Professional Nursing Programs**

## COVID Challenges still relevant in 2021

- Student attrition related to educational format changes (remote learning), childcare/family issues, financial hardship, fear
- Faculty losses
- Several schools offered Pass/Fail options for course grading or no grade options that would not affect GPA
- All programs indicated that they were affected by COVID; clinical and didactic education were most affected
- Decisions related to closures or ceasing face- to- face contact were primarily made by institutional administration
