

Social Services Block Grant Case Closure

Policy 14.04

Effective: April 15, 2024

Introduction

Subrecipients of Social Services Block Grant funding must follow standardized requirements regarding case closure.

Scope

The purpose of this policy is to define the circumstances under which Social Services Block Grant cases and referrals are closed. This standardizes closure reasons across the state ensuring both providers and clients can understand why and when services end.

Policy

Most Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) cases are opened by referral from Adult Protective Services (APS) when APS determines SSBG can assist vulnerable clients with maintaining independence. Because the circumstances of many SSBG clients are uncertain it must be outlined when and why a case or referral may be closed.

The following are valid reasons for closure:

- 1. Client has adequate care from other sources
- 2. Client refuses services
- 3. Client refuses care from appropriate, qualified staff
- 4. Client is self-sufficient and goals in the service plan have been achieved
- 5. Client is non-compliant with service plan
- 6. SSBG cases in which the client cancels/reschedules such that no services are provided in over thirty (30) days must close
- 7. APS requires closure
- 8. Client moves out of area
- 9. Client cannot be located
- 10. Adult day services fee not paid

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11. Client moves to a Long-Term Care Facility (LTCF)

Note: Refer to Nursing Homes and Institutions section of <u>14.01 SSBG Eligibility policy</u> for specifics regarding transitional care.

- 12. Client is deceased
- 13. Documented pattern of inappropriate behavior including cursing or disrespect toward staff
- 14. Client or household member threatens or engages in physical, sexual, or verbal violence toward provider staff
- 15. Client's home is unsafe for personal support assistant (PSA), including, but not limited to:
 - unsecured weapons on premises which client refuses to secure

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- client's home or premises are being used for the manufacture of methamphetamines or opioids
- aggressive, unsecured animals on premises

Denial of SSBG services and case closure, at times, may be appropriate and necessary. SSBG rules require that all clients receive proper notification of their right to file a grievance when services are denied. Denial of services for health and safety reasons requires consultation and approval in accordance with the Denial of Service section of the SSBG Documentation Procedures.

Notification of Termination

A notification of termination letter is generated through the case management system (CMS) and includes information on filing grievances in accordance with <u>14.10 SSBG Client Grievances Policy</u>. Case closure is not finalized until ten (10) calendar days after the provider has notified the client, but services are not required in between notification and case closure.

Allowable closure reasons are further defined in the supporting document <u>Allowable Reasons for SSBG Case</u> Closure.

Continuity of Services

With approval from the SSBG Program Coordinator, the provider has the discretion to reopen cases within ninety (90) calendar days if the client continues to display a significant need. This would not require a new referral or authorization of services from APS, and would be reopened under the Without Regard to Income (WRI) category.

Note: Personal support cases cannot be closed due to hoarding, pet waste, the need for pest control, or substance abuse that does not put the PSA in danger.
