Special Message from the TDHS Child Care Services Team

Today, our hearts and thoughts are with the families, children, educators, school administrators and all who have been impacted by the tragic event that occurred at Covenant School in Nashville. We greatly appreciate the emergency responders and the coordination of Woodmont Baptist Church in assisting the reunification efforts of families with their children.

The Department of Human Services is very sensitive to the social-emotional wellbeing and overall wellness of all involved and know the impact is far reaching. Tragic events such as these yield difficult conversations and emotions to manage for our children as well as for educators in early care and education environments. We want to share information on resources and tools that are available to assist in managing and supporting mental health during a time of emergency or tragedy.

The **Tennessee Child Care Resource & Referral Network** has coaching staff available with training on trauma informed care for Early Childhood Educators. Their Early Language Specialists have child-focused literature titles and activity handouts available on how to use the books and how to have conversations with the children.
