

The Tennessee Human Rights Commission is an independent state agency dedicated to educating the public and enforcing anti-discrimination laws in employment, housing,



and public accommodations. In the second quarter of the 2023-24 fiscal year, the Commission participated in various events throughout the state including the TN SHRM Conference & Exposition, the Celebrate Nashville Cultural Festival, and the National Civil Rights Museum's Freedom Awards. The 2023 Employment Law Seminar (ELS) was an annual training the Commission organized, in partnership with the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) and the Tennessee Department of Human Resources (DOHR). The ELS took place on Thursday, October 12th and provided attorneys, human resource professionals, and others with the knowledge necessary to support the latest best practices in the workplace. The seminar featured experts in the field of employment law including Keynote Speaker, Fred Bissinger of FordHarrison.

The Tennessee Celebration of International Human Rights Day took place on Wednesday, December. The Celebration honored the 75th Anniversary of the International Declaration of Human Rights. The theme for the event was "Dignity, Justice, and Freedom For All". The event honored individuals across the state of Tennessee who advanced human rights in their communities including Lifetime Achievement Honoree, Ludye Wallace. The event was co-hosted by THRC in collaboration with TN United for Human Rights, the Metro Human Relations Commission, the United Nations Association of Nashville - Cordell Hull Chapter, and others.

What's Going on in Civil Rights: Pregnant Worker's Fairness Act

The Pregnant Workers Fairness Act (PWFA)



went into effect on June 27, 2023. The PWFA requires that <u>covered employers</u> provide "reasonable accommodations" for employees with limitations due to pregnancy, childbirth or related medical conditions.

The PWFA is enforced by the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC). To learn more about the PWFA, you can visit the EEOC website <u>here</u>.

In Tennessee, the Tennessee Human Rights Act prohibits discrimination based pregnancy status or related medical conditions. For more information on the THRA and maternity leave, visit <u>here</u>.

As a Black veteran with disabilities from a small town, I have felt the sting of discrimination in my life. Hopefully, through our actions, others won't have to feel that sting in their lives.


Question: What do you hope to accomplish with the Commission?


