Greenbrier Guardsman commissioned as second lieutenant

GREENBRIER, Tenn. – A Greenbrier native graduated from the Tennessee National Guard's Officer Candidate School and commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Tennessee Army National Guard at Smyrna's Volunteer Training Site on Aug. 13.

2nd Lt. Kyle Bush completed a rigorous 18-month OCS training program designed to turn officer candidates into platoon leaders with the U.S. Army. The course is completed through monthly weekend drills and two, 15-day training session held in the summer. Officer candidates are tested physically and mentally, developing and performing leadership skills in a high-stress environment.

"Every moment in OCS was a lesson, every challenge a steppingstone," said Bush. "I am immeasurably proud of what I've achieved and humbled by the trust placed in me as a leader. I am ready to lead, serve, and make a difference."

Bush will serve as a platoon leader with the 194th Engineer Brigade, headquartered in Jackson.

Bush earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science from the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga and a master's degree from Bryan University.
