Update of Training Program by Tennessee 811

Mr. Turner reported the training of 349 individuals from 267 organizations. For 2020 year to date, 37 individuals from 29 organizations were trained. When approval was received for online training four individuals completed the training, seven are scheduled for June 24th, and 21 more are scheduled.

Discussion of future topics for next executive committee meeting.

A legislation update for 2020 was provided by Mr. Turner. The proposed 2020 legislation for changes to the Underground Utility Damage Prevention Act did not advance in both houses due to the COVID-19 related adjournment and state budget legislative priorities over all other proposed legislation.

The number of complaints for the upcoming July 15th meeting was discussed.
