STATE BUILDING COMMISSION April 9, 2020

Commissioner David Salyers State Architect Ann McGauran Lieutenant Governor McNally stated that the purpose of this meeting is to consider the items on the agenda for the April meeting of the State Building Commission. Tennessee Code Annotated §8-44-108 provides that if a quorum of members is not physically present at the meeting, other members may be retained for a vote via electronic or other means of communication if certain statutory requirements are met.

A determination has been made that the electronic communication in this meeting by the members is a necessity based on the following facts and circumstances:

- 1. The Commission has regularly scheduled monthly meetings around which agencies and institutions plan certain of their operational actions and a 30-day delay will cause an operational hardship for certain of the agencies and institutions having matters on today's agenda.
- 2. The current public health crisis resulting from the COVID-19 virus has resulted in declarations of a "State of Emergency" by the State and local governments; the limiting of meetings to 10 persons or less; and the closure of government office buildings with the direction that government employees work from home.
- 3. There are matters on the agenda which are time sensitive and there will be operational hardships if the Commission is unable to render decisions on these matters in April.

Treasurer Lillard asked if there was an estimate on when the project would be completed. Commissioner Salvers replied that it would be completed and targeted to open in the fall of 2021. Secretary Hargett

asked if it would be early fall or late fall. Commissioner Salyers replied that the target open date is Labor Day weekend. Secretary Hargett stated he was pleased to hear that the target date was in early fall.

Lieutenant Governor McNally asked how cost overruns can be prevented. Commissioner Branscom stated that they used the Construction Manager/General Contractor (CM/GC) approach and stated that the architect and contractor worked together on the pricing. She said that they are in attendance at this meeting and she would like to let them explain what actually happened in this particular case and why we are in this situation. Mr. Neuber stated that they worked with Doster Construction for the last couple of years tracking the costs. Mr. Neuber stated that most of their cost estimates were done off of local historical costs that they then checked against what Doster estimated. When the project was put on the street the numbers they were receiving did not match historical market data for a project like this. Mr. Neuber stated they dug in to see what was driving the costs, whether it was scope, scale or what. He stated that it seemed to be market conditions of the location. The local market was impacted by regional markets driving the costs substantially higher than anticipated. They checked the numbers with two other reputable contractors in the Nashville market, Crane Construction and Southland Constructors. Those contractors had a full month to get pricing and their numbers came back much higher than those contractors anticipated as well. Mr. Neuber stated that they spent hours reviewing with Doster what drove the costs and they agreed that it seems to be what the market says that this project wants to cost. These are the numbers they have from subcontractors, and they don't line up with anyone's historical data. It may be a location thing since right now there's no reason to travel for construction work and that drove the cost substantially higher. It doesn't seem that any of the general contractor costs were out of line with the historical data and is the cost increase was mostly on the subcontractor's side.

Lieutenant Governor McNally asked when they realized there would be cost overruns. Mr. Neuber stated that the original bid numbers were mid-November. The numbers were checked against historical data in August and September and at that point they were still tracking generally on budget. Lieutenant Governor McNally asked if the Commission was notified of the cost increase and if at that time were the cost overruns estimated to be 9.4 million? Mr. Neuber stated that the costs have stayed consistent since that timeframe. Commissioner Branscom stated that they knew about the additional cost in November and since then they have been comparing the cost projections with two other contractors. They have also been looking at the project to determine if they could reduce the costs but a reduction in scope was not reasonable. The last several months STREAM has been working with the Design and Construction teams to try to get the budget as tight as possible.

Commissioner Branscom asked Gregg Lynch with Doster Construction to confirm the target date to complete the project is fall of 2021 and specifically Labor Day weekend. Mr. Lynch confirmed that

they are looking at August 10, 2021 for a construction completion date to allow the State to start moving their personnel in and in order to train the staff for the ability to open the inn on Labor Day weekend to visitors.

Commissioner Branscom asked Mr. Lynch if he could provide any additional insight regarding the construction estimate. Mr. Lynch stated that Mr. Neuber summed it up well. Mr. Lynch introduced Bryan Nelson, lead estimator. Mr. Nelson stated that there was subcontractor input a year ago when an estimate was done. However, Doster became aware that subcontractors were using historical data to provide those numbers to Doster. It wasn't until the November timeframe, when the subcontractors started reaching out to their suppliers, when they started seeing the costs increase for the whole project. Since then the pricing has held steady and Doster was unsuccessful in reducing the cost.

OSA Policy & Procedures

- Reported the following policy revision to the OSA Policy for Construction Delivery Methods in the section entitled Procurement through Design/Bid/Build, revising the last sentence of Section C.5 thereof:
 - C.5. <u>Bid Submittal</u>: Bidders shall normally be required to submit sealed bids in an envelope furnished by the Commission through the Designer or the State Procurement Agency. Information required by the Contractor Licensing law shall have been provided on the front of the bid envelope or the bid will not be opened. Identification of the Project, the bidder, and the bidder's Plumbing, Electrical, HVAC, Masonry and Geothermal subcontractors shall also be provided on the bid envelope, and such named subcontractors shall be used in the capacity listed. If a bid is mailed, the outer envelope shall state that the envelope contains a sealed bid, so that the sealed bid is not opened when the mail is opened. It shall be the specific responsibility of the bidder to ensure that its bid is received at the appointed place prior to the announced closing time for the receipt of bids. Late delivery of a bid for any reason, including late delivery by United States mail, shall disqualify the bid. Electronic bids will not be considered. Electronic bidding may be permitted in special and unique situations with the prior written approval of the State Architect and the Comptroller of the Treasury of both the special and unique situation warranting the acceptance of electronic bids and the electronic bid process to be utilized. Any use of electronic bidding shall be reported to the Commission.
