Minutes: 06/10/2021 SBC President Randy Boyd introduced Mr. Lanny Cope with Cope Associates

Architects to give the presentation. Mr. Cope stated that they anticipate a construction start immediately after the upcoming football season. Mr. Cope stated that the seating, video boards and the club shell will be complete before the start of the 2022 season and the finish out of the club space underneath will be completed toward the end of the season. Mr. Cope stated that the bid package is significantly below the bid target for the project since this is just a portion of the work being performed by

the project.

Lieutenant Governor McNally asked if there will be a seating loss in the stadium due to the renovations. Mr. Cope stated that there would be a loss of seats and reviewed the presentation that showed concourse 2 would have 236 fewer seats, the north upper plaza will have 1,351 fewer seats and the west lower bowl would have 1,744 fewer seats. The new seats are significantly wider and more comfortable than what the stadium currently has in those same locations. Lieutenant Governor estimated that there will be about 3,200 less seats. Mr. Cope replied that was correct.

The Commission approved a revision in project scope and the EDP as presented by Cope Associates Architecture.

Comment: A revision in project scope is requested to remove Sites 2 and 3 because after the initial

project bid it became apparent the current funding was only enough for one site. At that time, the designer revisited its initial estimate of the construction cost and determined that it had not taken into account the full scope of the project or the increased costs resulting from a small bidder market and COVID-19 pandemic. The Site 1 scope was rebid and the one bid that was received will use the majority of the construction funding in this project. The designer has confirmed that the bid received for Site 1 reflects fair and reasonable pricing for the work. The scope for Sites 2 and 3 will be included as part of a future budget request.

The designer fee will be reduced as a result of this scope change.

Comment: Two qualified designers will be established to allow for consistent design services for multiple

office space consolidation projects utilizing Alternative Workplace Solutions (AWS) standards. It is anticipated there will be 15-25 separate office space consolidation projects having a cumulative fee potential up to \$900,000 and consisting of interior renovation elements such as new finishes; restroom upgrades; lighting upgrades; furniture; reconfiguration of space within current moveable furniture guidelines; and modification of all associated electrical, mechanical, plumbing, fire protection; access control, and communication systems. Designers will be selected for individual SBC office space consolidation projects in State-owned and leased office space throughout the Middle Tennessee Region based on workload and their experience within a specific facility to

ensure continuity.

All future projects utilizing this procurement will commence within the next five years. It is anticipated that the majority of the future projects will be approved and commence within the next

year and have concurrent schedules.

Minutes: 06/10/2021 SBC Lieutenant Governor McNally asked when the project is scheduled to

be completed. Commissioner Branscom stated that most of the work would occur in the first year but some locations are in leases and those could take up to five years. DGS has some options to get out of leases with fees. She said the timeline may get a little faster but the longest

would be five years.

Lieutenant Governor McNally asked what agencies would be affected. Commissioner Branscom stated that there are twenty-two agencies and gave examples of some of the agencies but stated that most departments are involved and other governmental entities like THDA

and THEC are also involved.

Lieutenant Governor McNally asked what the goal was in terms of the amount of space to be vacated. Commissioner Branscom stated that 84% of the state portfolio of space is in Davidson County. Downtown and Metro Center have 4 million square feet and the goal is to reduce a million square feet from the state portfolio.

Comptroller Mumpower stated that the reduction is in square feet and not the number of employees and asked if the plan is based on initiatives to either move employees to a permanent work from home status or to a rotation of work from home and in the office. Comptroller Mumpower also asked what the plan was for accommodating our important state personnel while reducing the space. Commissioner Branscom stated that those are all factors and that it is a combination of factors. There will be people working in an AWS scenario. AWS, alternative workplace solutions, is an initiative successfully employed by the state since 2015/2016. There will be more people moving into the AWS scenario which typically involves, working in the office 2 or 3 days per week and on site or from home the remainder of the week. Commissioner Branscom stated that they will be reducing square footage by selling a couple of properties like the Citizen Plaza property that was approved for sale by the commission. The state also has the ability to consolidate into other buildings. For example, the multiagency law enforcement training academy (MLETA) combines some law enforcement type agencies; THP, Homeland Security, Department of Corrections and others; at the new MLETA which will allow DGS to reduce square footage at the locations where they are currently located. Some of those properties are at Foster Avenue and Clover Bottom. It is a combination of all those factors that will allow DGS to reduce the state portfolio by a million square feet.

Comptroller Mumpower asked if DGS is working with the Commissioners to ensure that services provided by our great state employees to Tennessee citizens are not reduced with the change in work environment. Commissioner Branscom confirmed and stated that they are making sure that productivity is maintained or increased with this process. DOHR has done some surveys and reviewed data showing that productivity has increased and improved during the time in which the state has been employing AWS and during this past year with many working from home.

Commissioner Eley asked for confirmation that the long-term goal will be to vacate all leased space in Nashville and Metro Center. Commissioner Branscom confirmed that the goal is to be out of all the leases for office space by 2027, with one exception. The exception is a Federally funded lease for the Department of Disability Determination. The Federal government has said that they want to remain in that lease.

The Commission approved a procurement and to select two designers.

Secretary Hargett asked for more information on the TSU Perimeter Road change order with a 121% increase. Secretary Hargett asked what happened and what we do internally as a result. State Architect McGauran replied that this is the first subproject of the larger Perimeter Road project and they hit a major electrical line at the beginning of the project. She added that TBR was taking some money from a future subproject for this project to address this unforeseen expanse. Mr. Alex Smart with TSU stated that when the contractor started digging the line was not located where it was thought to be. The line was three feet higher than it should have been and did not have the required warning tape 12" above the line and it did not have the expected concrete enclosure so there was no resistance to the excavator. There was no way of knowing that the line was danger prior to the line being cut. State Architect McGauran asked Mr. Smart to confirm that once the line was repaired those items were fixed. Mr. Smart replied yes, that TSU installed the power line four feet deeper and encased it in concrete the way it is supposed to be and included the warning tape. Secretary Hargett asked whose responsibility would that have been to know the location of the line. State Architect McGauran stated that they rely on a number of pieces of information to locate underground utilities including historical documentation and utility locator services. In this particular case, they all said the line was in a place that it wasn't. This is not something that happens very often and the conditions at this location were a unique case. Secretary Hargett confirmed there was no negligence on the part of the contractor.
