Mr. Ludman stated that the project is in budget and on schedule. Lieutenant Governor McNally asked how much revenue is expected with the additional seating. Mr. Ludman replied that he understood that the West Lower Bowl, which is affiliated with the West Field Club, is expected to create about \$5.4 million per year in revenue. Mr. Ludman stated that

he is unsure how that compares with previous revenue. He stated that he is unsure what the amounts were for the North but understood that the response has been positive this season and that all the seats were sold.

The Commission approved a revision in project funding and a partial EDP as presented by Cope Associates Architecture.

They would have to come back for a future project to address the balconies. TBR is studying the best solution for the balconies and are considering replacing the balconies or removing them which would result in a renovation of the façade of the apartments.

Lieutenant Governor McNally asked how old the existing stairs were. Mr. Tracy stated they were completed about 20 years ago. They were wood framed because of the type of construction at the time. They have deteriorated over time. There is a separate project that was recently approved by the State Architect where there are damages in one apartment due to students having a function inside the apartment which damaged the building structure. The Campus applied for an insurance claim to assist with the repair work. Lieutenant Governor McNally asked if the students were punished for their behavior. Mr. Tracy replied that he doesn't know but will ask TSU.

Speaker Sexton asked how much certainty there is in the \$52 million plant fund balance. Vice President Allen replied that they provided detailed information on their fund balance back in August to the Commission and he is 100% committed that they have \$52.7 million.

Speaker Sexton stated that there was a financial audit done recently showing \$3 million unaccounted for. Vice President Allen replied that there was no money missing from their financial statements and he would need further clarification to answer the Speakers question.

Comptroller Mumpower stated that he would need his audit staff to speak to the details but the financial audit did show many repeat findings. Some for five to seven years in a row and including work with the Foundation. He apologized for not having his statements or audit staff with him. The financial audit showed a need for better bookkeeping procedures. Vice President Allen thanked Comptroller Mumpower and stated that the audit was an unmodified opinion which is the highest opinion you can receive on a financial statement audit. He agreed that there were findings and stated that TSU are addressing them. In the prior year there were seven findings and now there were four which showed progress. Vice President Allen stated that he wanted to be clear that there was no misappropriation of funds resulting in a loss of \$3 million.

Speaker Sexton asked if they knew where the \$3 million went. Vice President Allen stated that their financial statements were materially correct in accordance with GAP and those are audited by Comptroller Mumpower's office. Speaker Sexton stated that they can review the audit documents. Vice President Allen stated that they would provide any additional requested information but neither their financial statements nor their findings indicated a \$3 million misappropriation. Speaker Sexton stated that he did not

say misappropriation he just said missing. Vice President Allen stated that there is not \$3 million in missing funds. Speaker Sexton asked if Vice President Allen if he was certain there is \$52 million in plant funds. Vice President Allen replied that as he previously answered, yes that is correct.

Comptroller Mumpower asked if the \$52 million includes the money necessary to pay for the leases of the hotels. Vice President Allen replied that is correct. Comptroller Mumpower asked for clarification if the money to pay the hotels is included in the \$52 million or is that the balance after taking the hotel funds out. Vice President Allen stated that in their FY23 budget they included the cost of the hotels as part of their budget to clear it through ENG. They did set aside \$7.3 million in funds, as mentioned in August, for the hotel leases. So, there will be, right now, about \$5.2 million of the \$7.3 million that is going to come out of the plant funds to cover the hotel costs. Therefore, todays \$52 million will be reduced to between \$47 and \$48 million.

Speaker Sexton stated that the Lieutenant Governor previously asked about the \$10.8 million already encumbered. Vice President Allen replied that is correct. Speaker Sexton asked if the \$5.2 million for the hotel leases is included in the \$10.8 million or is it an addition. Vice President Allen replied that the \$5.2 million is included in the \$10.8 but the majority is for their new residence hall debt service.

The Commission approved a revision in project budget and funding.
