Lieutenant Governor McNally asked about the Fall Creek Falls Inn project. Commissioner Meghreblian stated that they have started demolition and are in the design phase of the project. The Commissioner stated that they are a little behind schedule, but felt comfortable that they can catch up. Lieutenant Governor McNally stated that the project schedule is important and the project is important to the citizens in that community. Additionally, Senator Bowling and Representative Sexton have been very interested in the project and its status. Commissioner Meghreblian stated that this project is important to TDEC, as well as the visitors who are excited to visit when the inn has been rebuilt. The Commissioner stated that the team is optimistic that they will be able to get the project back on schedule.

Comment: The purpose is to lease space to the University of Memphis Research Foundation (UMRF), a

not-for profit corporation, to be used to foster collaborations with researchers at the University of Memphis and to build employment pipelines for University of Memphis students. UMRF will lease all of the Highland Library and the first floor (7,000 sf) of the Defense Audit Building (33,000 sf) at \$1.00/sf. The lease provides that upon SBC approval of an amendment to the lease, additional space owned by the University of Memphis can be leased by UMRF.

A waiver of advertising and appraisal are requested because of the anticipated benefits to the UoM students from this UMRF program. This lease is part of the first phase of UoM's CommuniTech Research Park initiative. UMRF intends to sublease space in the leased premises to emerging companies at market rental rates. UoM will report annually to the State Building Commission the names of subtenants in the leased premises and pertinent sublease terms.

The UMRF is a state-approved 501C non-profit entity set up with the state's approval for the explicit purposes of supporting the mission of the University. The University's expectations of UMRF is that all surpluses from the CommuniTech Research Park will be reinvested directly into the modernization of the pertinent buildings and the growth of the initiative. Ultimately all revenues generated through this initiative are, directly or indirectly, invested into promoting research at the UoM and generating employment opportunities for our students. All renovation work in the leased premises receive the prior written approval of UoM.

UoM will be responsible for all maintenance, standard utility and building upkeep in alignment with their role as landlord. UMRF will be responsible for janitorial costs, limited copier usage, parking and network fees during the term of the lease. Either party has the right to terminate for convenience on 60 days' notice.

Minutes: 10/11/2018 SBC President Rudd gave a presentation of a pilot for a research park at the

University. Lieutenant Governor McNally asked what the source of funds are for the work needed to prepare the space for occupancy. President Rudd stated that the money is already available within the

budget of UMRF.

Comptroller Wilson asked about the relationship between the University and UMRF and how comfortable the University is in leasing out the property to the UMRF for this purpose. Ted Townsend with the University of Memphis stated that UMFR is a separate 501.C3

organization that supports the University. Mr. Townsend added that UMRF is board operated and that several members of the University's leadership team are on the board. UMRF handles the promotion and development of research and technology advancement on the campus.

Secretary Hargett confirmed that this is not the first venture of the UMRF. President Rudd replied that is correct and that they have had two.

Lieutenant Governor McNally asked if the outdoor eating areas would be heated and Mr. Johnson replied that they are not heated and the upper two levels are not covered but the bottom level is covered.

The Commission approved the EDP as presented by Johnson Architecture, Inc. and utilizing a previously awarded contractor for a

portion of the work.

Comment: These leases will provide housing for students displaced from Laurel Hall on the UTK

Campus. The lease term is less than one year and a justification for not advertising has been provided. Consistent with SBC Policy, the UT System Chief Financial Officer has

approved waiver of termination for convenience.

The landlords and locations selected for lease constitute all of the apartment complexes in the immediate proximity of the UTK campus with significant numbers of units available for rental at this time. Leases with each of the landlords are currently being finalized and will collectively be for approximately the total number of beds and the total annual effective cost set forth above. The Attorney General will approve the final form of each lease for

form, legality and consistency with the approved action.

Minutes: 10/11/2018 SBC Lieutenant Governor McNally asked what caused the mold problem

and why it wasn't prevented. President DiPietro stated that the Environmental Consultant determined that the high moisture climate in September; the air conditioners being controlled unit by unit; and the ability to open windows created a bloom of black mold. All of the residence halls were checked at the beginning of the semester and they were clean. In order to not have cross contamination the hall has to be vacated for the rest of the academic year. President DiPietro stated that the students can opt in and receive a 50% refund of their housing fee plus replacement housing arranged by the University under these leases or they can opt out and receive a 100% refund of their housing fee but will have

to find their own replacement housing.

The Commission approved master leases.

Comment: This action will modify the application of the Memphis Tourism Development Zone (TDZ) approved

on December 18, 2000, as modified on April 19, 2010 and again on May 22, 2018, to add a hotel as an additional Qualified Public Use Facility (QPUF) in the TDZ. This modification would allow the City of Memphis to spend their incremental tax revenue to develop a hotel etc. This modification would not increase the size of their Tourist Development Zone (TDZ) nor would it extend the 30 year maximum period to receive the incremental state revenue; however, in accordance with TCA § 7-88-106(a)(2) as amended by Chapter 1058 of the Public Acts of 2018, the city will be allowed to continue to receive the incremental local revenue for a period up to 30 years from the date the hotel opens if placed into service by December 31, 2022. This is in accordance with the Convention

Center and Tourist Development Act of 1998.

The increase in project budget is attributed to across the board under-estimation of costs, inflation in the construction industry and required abatement. This project was particularly impacted by increased labor costs in Middle TN because work in an historic building is very

labor intensive.

Minutes: 10/11/2018 SBC Comptroller Wilson asked how much is in the FRF Reserve account that

> is not obligated. Deputy Commissioner John Hull stated that he could get that information to the members. Comptroller Wilson asked if this item was referred to the ESC would the delay jeopardize the contract. Deputy Commissioner Hull replied "no" and stated that the contractor is

willing to hold their bid.

Commissioner Martin stated that Finance & Administration has the responsibility to identify the funding and funding sources and they are comfortable with this use of FRF Reserves. F&A knows that there is slightly over \$27 million confirmed in FRF Reserves but believes that closer to \$40 million is uncommitted. F&A feels comfortable that there are sufficient funds in the FRF Reserves in hand and anticipated for this project to move forward. Commissioner Martin stated that the John Sevier building is an old building and there will be more issues the longer it goes without repairs. He also added that he is concerned that the cost will go up if this is delayed and that it is important to complete this project to alleviate the difficult office conditions that the Attorney

General's office employees have endured. Commissioner Martin stated that he respects Comptroller Wilson's expressions of concern about the FRF Reserves balance but he felt comfortable acting on this today.

Attorney General Herbert Slatery was recognized and stated that this project has been long delayed and provided some history on the project. He recognized that the initial effort started in 2013 with an approved exterior project consisting of the windows and roof. Later, another project was approved to address interior renovations. Later the two projects were combined to be an exterior and interior renovation. Attorney General Slatery stated that after two projects, three project managers and moving two times in three or four different buildings he is concerned about the effect on the performance of the lawyers in the Attorney General's Office, and feels that it is important for their performance that this project be completed as quickly as possible. Attorney General Slatery stated that they have been patient and asked for any consideration for this project that the Commission could provide.

Comptroller Wilson asked if this was referred to ESC would it delay the start of work. Deputy Commissioner John Hull stated that it would delay it couple of weeks.

Treasurer Lillard stated that in light of the Attorney General's statements the Commission should go ahead and approve this request.

Treasurer Lillard also stated that he would like additional information on how the budget estimates were off by \$11 million. Also, with FRF he added that it is good to have ample reserves but the theory of the FRF is for it to function as close as possible to a necessary capital maintenance funding mechanism and not have excessive reserves. He requested a discussion on this topic at a later time.

Deputy Commissioner Hull stated that the budget was planned several years ago and escalation of costs have gone up beyond what was anticipated. He added that even up to two weeks prior to the bid the design firm affirmed they thought the project budget was accurate. He relayed that since this particular project was in a historical building the design team knew that the cost of labor would be high, but they did not appreciate how high it would be. This project will have a seventeen month duration and should be complete in the spring of 2020 if it stays on schedule.

Treasurer Lillard stated that if STREAM anticipates to continue to have these conditions, then future estimates need to have a separate escalation factor of cost so they can be properly funded. Deputy Commissioner Hull stated that STREAM has gone back to projects that are being planned and have added additional escalation costs in light of this experience. Treasurer Lillard stated they would like to get the Attorney General's Office properly housed as soon as possible.

Secretary Hargett confirmed that as the Treasurer asked, the Commission is asking what an appropriate amount of reserves would be for FRF since the FRF is not meant to be building a great reserve.

Lieutenant Governor McNally asked Deputy Commission Hull to make sure to answer the questions from the Comptroller, Treasurer and Secretary of State.

The Commission approved a revision to project budget and funding and awarding a contract (Hardaway Construction Company).
