Minutes:	08/21/2014 SBC Commissioner Oglesby presented Phase 2 of the study and the Department of General Services' analysis for the evaluation of the Cordell Hull and Central Services buildings. He provided a timeline of events and stated that the State's vendor, Jones Lang LaSalle, was asked to report on renovation and long term maintenance costs. He introduced David Plummer, Centric Architecture, who was selected to conduct a full evaluation of deferred maintenance and to look at tenant improvements to make it a useable office building. Mr. Plummer stated that they did a timeline comparison and, while the reports differed in some ways, their major findings were similar to those of the original report. Mr. Plummer went over the five scenarios identified in the original report and stated that Centric's scope was not to be real estate advisors, but to compare maintenance costs and to identify any differences. Commissioner Oglesby stated that, upon completion of Centric's report, DGS proceeded with its own analysis of the scenarios in the original report and some additional considerations, which he then discussed in detail. This DGS analysis included		

consideration of Centric's observation that the condition and the rehabilitation potential of Cordell Hull and Central Services were different enough that the State should decide the future of the two buildings separately. This observation led DGS to develop the scenario of renovating Cordell Hull but demolishing Central Services and replacing it with a parking garage containing about 150 spaces, and with a greenspace roof. Estimates developed by DGS suggest this would be the most cost-effective scenario for the State. Commissioner Oglesby expressed concern about the physical condition of Cordell Hull, which he noted continues to deteriorate, and about the safety of the occupants working there. He specifically cited mold and air quality issues, the presence of asbestos and lead paint, HVAC system deficiencies and the unavailability of replacement parts for obsolete equipment, and code and life safety violations throughout the building. He also pointed out that, with the building in its current condition and needing approximately \$16 million in deferred maintenance, a critical mechanical system could fail at any time, necessitating costly emergency evacuation of the occupants and possibly creating significant work delays and interruptions in service to taxpayers. Such an emergency evacuation would not only be costly, he said, but would put employees in less convenient and less productive work space.

Speaker Harwell asked if the State needed this office space. Commissioner Oglesby responded that it was more cost effective to have owned office space than leased office space. He said there are other employees across the state that are currently in leased space that could be more effectively housed in a State office building like Cordell Hull. Speaker Harwell expressed the need for more parking and asked when DGS would be making an official recommendation. Commissioner Oglesby replied that he could make a recommendation that day. Treasurer Lillard asked for his recommendation.

Commissioner Oglesby stated that, since he had not prepared a formal recommendation, he would give the summary points of that recommendation. His primary recommendation was that the occupants of Cordell Hull be relocated promptly and that Cordell Hull then be renovated, with the Central Services building being demolished since it cannot be upgraded or updated to become a cost-effective facility for the State. The Commissioner explained that his recommendation to renovate the building after moving the occupants out, rather than renovating with them in place, could not be justified solely on a cost basis, but that there were other significant factors besides cost to consider. Among these factors are risks associated with the disruption that renovations would cause for employees working in the building at the time, and unknown risks from continued water intrusion, possible building system failure, and exposure to environmental hazards. He said the Cordell Hull renovation would be more disruptive to the occupants than the Tennessee Tower and State Capitol renovations due to the exterior work involved and the loss of major systems, such as HVAC and plumbing. He discussed the cost of doing business and said it was worth considering the cost of moving the occupants out before renovating, adding that the State's competitors for employees would not consider renovating a building of this magnitude with occupants still in the building. He said that one has to look at the whole picture and consider the pain and risk by delaying this decision. Commissioner Oglesby said that, to add value to the process, DGS considered the bigger scheme of things. The State has needs to renovate other buildings in the downtown area, such as the James K. Polk and Rachel Jackson buildings. He said since they don't have checker space on the board left to move those people around during similar levels of renovations, they believe the Cordell Hull renovation plan provides an opportunity to save the State money by creating that checker space. By entering into a long-term lease for 10 years, it would allow the people in buildings to be renovated to move into Cordell Hull after it's been renovated, and not have to enter into short-term premium cost leases.

Secretary Hargett asked what kind of consideration is given when determining who gets to stay downtown and who doesn't. Commissioner Oglesby responded that DGS is in a partnership with the other agencies and they have to find a balance as to where they go and what is in the best interest of the State. Kimberly Lamb was asked by Commissioner Oglesby to talk more about DGS' partnership with other agencies and discussions regarding space needs.

Treasurer Lillard confirmed with Commissioner Oglesby that what he was recommending, in general terms, was to renovate the Cordell Hull building, demolish the Central Services building and replace it with a parking garage. Commissioner Oglesby agreed and again stressed his view that it was important to act as quickly as possible to move people out of Cordell Hull. He said they have a lease on the table with terms good until September 9, but they are still finalizing the wording and would like to move forward with that. He said they have some funds available and would like to start leveraging those funds to go ahead and start pre-construction services before next fiscal year, and that they would come back to the Commission and ask for additional funding for the full scope.

If the State is unable to conclude the currently negotiated leases before they expire on September 9, Commissioner Oglesby said, it would likely take another 18 months from the time discussions start to negotiate new lease agreements and to have space built out for the tenants. During that time, the risks from continued water intrusion and the likelihood of mechanical system failure would only increase. He also added that if leases are not concluded now, the business model for renovating Cordell Hull would change during that 18 months, perhaps to the point where renovating Cordell Hull might no longer be a valid recommendation.

Treasurer Lillard complimented Commissioner Oglesby, stating that DGS had done a great job under his leadership by putting more emphasis on looking at all the requirements necessary to deal with aged buildings and their deferred maintenance needs. He suggested that the Commission needed to hear more details and receive an actual proposal, and recommended that the matter be referred to the Executive Subcommittee with authority to act. Secretary Hargett stated that the request before the Commission was just for acknowledgement of the report. Commissioner Oglesby expressed his concern about the timeline from the beginning discussions to procurement and hoped to be able to move forward with the lease they have under discussion so they could start moving people by next April.

Treasurer Lillard made a motion that the SBC acknowledge receipt of the report and analysis by General Services and recommended that all matters regarding the Cordell Hull portion of the project be referred to the Executive Subcommittee with authority to act. Secretary Hargett further asked that the letter from Patrick McIntyre, Executive Director of the Tennessee Historical Commission, be made a part of the Minutes. The motion was properly seconded, and passed without objection.

Dear Members of the State Building Commission:

Under TCA 4-11-111, the Tennessee Historical Commission is accorded the authority to review and comment to the State Building Commission on "historically, architecturally or culturally significant" state-owned properties. We understand that the August 21 regular State Building Commission meeting will include the results from Phase II of the report by Centric Architecture, demonstrating it is more cost-effective to renovate the Cordell Hull Building than to build a new building of similar size and quality.

As the State Historic Preservation Office, our agency has previously determined that the Cordell Hull Building is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. Following the initial report on the building in 2013, we urged the Department of General Services to take another look at this building. We applaud the commitment shown to do so and feel that the resulting studies have proven that the structure can be rehabilitated and continue to serve as an asset to the State. Rehabilitating the Cordell Hull Building is also a fiscally sound option, and more cost effective than demolishing the building.

With its solid cut limestone exterior and exceptional Tennessee marble gracing its interior--much of it painstakingly book-matched to achieve handsome patterns-- the quality of construction materials far exceeds what is available today. It was clear that this building was built to be a permanent and worthy addition to the Capitol Complex, a role it has fulfilled for over 60 years. It is our turn to make the necessary commitment to maintain this structure for another generation of service. I hope the results of the report will help shed light on this landmark and its strong potential for continued use. Thank you.
