Minutes:	12/17/2015 SBC Comptroller Wilson began a discussion regarding the lengthy payback period to recoup the cost of the energy efficient improvements. Bob Balzar, Director of Empower TN, was recognized and responded that the useful life of the installed improvements will exceed the payback period and so there is a positive benefit to the State. In response to Comptroller Wilson he said it was not what the industry would call "low hanging fruit", but it's important to upgrade equipment to save energy and reduce maintenance costs over many years.				
	Secretary Hargett asked if the payback is 9-11 years, what is the average useful life? Commissioner Martineau responded it was about 20 years, but that was the direct payback of just the energy savings vs. the cost of replacing the lights. He said they didn't even estimate the benefit of reduced labor costs to change the lights and maintain them because these lights will last much longer than the existing lights.				

Commissioner Martineau said they were also very conservative in estimating payback projections, assuming no rate increases, and found when those were put in place that the paybacks are much faster. Secretary Hargett confirmed that the payback is essentially based strictly on the purchase of the lights and energy savings. He then asked, if 20 years is the most conservative, what is the best estimate? Commissioner Martineau responded that some of the lighting projects done in buildings are getting paybacks of 3-4 years. After general discussion, the Commission approved a project, budget, scope, funding and sources of funding utilizing the Statewide Electrical Contract to perform the work and the Agency Consultant for design.

Minutes: 12/17/2015 SBC Lieutenant Governor Ramsey discussed the remaining \$8 million in the project and asked if the project was completed, why it wasn't closed out. TDOC Chief Financial Officer, Wes Landers, was called to the podium to answer questions regarding why money remained in the project and how much money remained in the project. Mr. Landers said that TDOC believed that the \$8 million was the majority of the remaining funds. Peter Heimbach added that any funds remaining in a closed out project become residual, and that the legislature, through the Appropriations Act, gives the Department of Finance and Administration the authority to distribute those residual funds, as appropriate, to projects that need them. In this case, it was planned to move the money to a second project at the Bledsoe facility in order to keep them within the Bledsoe facility. He added that one reason the 2004 project remains open is due to environmental permitting issues which will require monitoring and the expenditure of funds for several more years. The Commission approved a revision in project budget, funding and source of funding.
