### MINUTES STATE BUILDING COMMISSION March 30, 2016

The State Building Commission met this day at 8:00 a.m. in House Hearing Room 30 of the Legislative Plaza, Nashville, Tennessee, with the following members and Departments present. | Minutes:  | 03/30/2016 SBC Commissioner Oglesby presented the request before turning it<br>over to Deputy Commissioner John Hull who introduced the three teams making the<br>presentation. Gary Everton and Sheila Dial-Barton of EOA Architects, the building<br>designer, discussed the exterior of the building and the interior spaces. Patrick<br>Gallagher of Gallagher & Associates, the Exhibit Designer, detailed the exhibit<br>spaces. Steve Curtis of Compass Partners provided the cost information stating that<br>it was currently in budget.  |

Speaker Harwell asked whether the size of the new gallery space is sufficient, noting reports that the new area is reported to be 11,000 less than that of the current facility and the lack of sufficient storage space in the new building requires continued use of the existing location as storage. Mr. Gallagher responded that the efficiency of laying out exhibits in a new museum facility specifically designed for this purpose will allow for making the building a much better museum experience with less square footage while accommodating more exhibits that are bigger and more dynamic. Commissioner Oglesby added that renovation of the existing space for storage is not part of the project, but it is being investigated.

Speaker Harwell then asked about parking, security and long term maintenance costs. Mr. Everton responded that they believe the 160 spaces in the front parking lot and the school bus lane will provide sufficient parking. Mr. Hull responded that on the security issue, there is a team of people working to determine how best to provide security for the building. As to the maintenance costs, Mr. Hull stated that museums, in general, are costly and they are looking at ways to make it as efficient as possible. Secretary Hargett stated if you don't have adequate parking, it is hard to make it accessible to Tennesseans. Mr. Everton said it was meant to be a pedestrian experience, and being in an urban area, there are multiple ways of arriving at the facility. He said that people will come sporadically, with a large percentage of people already in town for another event. Mr. Everton correlated that there's no need to build a church parking lot to accommodate larger attendances for just twice a year at Christmas and Easter.

Treasurer Lillard stated he would like for the entire team to work with the Division of Risk Management to keep the situation in hand with respect to risk assessment, and was told they would. He asked if the museum was being built so it can be expanded, and Mr. Everton stated that the northern end is intended to be the expansion space.

Representative Steve McDaniel was recognized and asked how people from across the State will be able to access the museum from such a great distance. Mr. Gallagher responded that virtual connections all across the State are available through the digital learning center and anything can be accessed online as part of their curriculum. Representative McDaniel stated there was interest in exposing the Red Grooms carousel and asked if there were plans for displaying it. Mr. Gallagher replied that there was a plan for a pavilion, but it would involve separate funding.

The Commission approved the Early Design Phase as presented.
