Steve Patrick stated that TWRA will be monitoring the streams to make certain that this drilling will not impact any wildlife. Staff referred to Subcommittee with recommendation.

He also stipulated that this approval did not commit to any future mining leases. The motion was properly seconded and passed without objection.
