Page 9-10 **CLEARING AN INCIDENT** BY EXCEPTIONAL MEANS **ALL FOUR** of the following conditions must be met in order to clear an incident by Exceptional Means: 1) Investigation must have established the identity of at least one offender. (Must include age, race, sex, resident status and ethnicity) Page 9 CLEARING AN INCIDENT BY EXCEPTIONAL MEANS 2) Sufficient probable cause must have been developed to support the arrest, charging, and prosecution of the offender. 3) The exact location of the offender must be known so that an arrest could be made. 4) There must be a reason outside of law enforcement control, which prevents the arrest.

If you cannot meet all 4 conditions, the incident cannot be cleared exceptionally.

REPORTING STOLEN PROPERTY OFFENSES

For TIBRS, a Stolen Property Offense is the receiving, buying, selling, possession, concealing, or transporting any property with the knowledge that it has been unlawfully taken, as by burglary, embezzlement, fraud, larceny, robbery, etc. (TIBRS Manual, 14th Edition, pg. 79)

It requires that the offender has the property in their possession <u>and</u> have knowledge that the property is stolen. When an officer recovers stolen property in an individual's possession, the officer may *charge* the person with theft (as per TCA), but for TIBRS, a Stolen Property Offense will be reported.

EXAMPLE:

An individual is stopped by an officer for a minor traffic violation. The officer notices that the license plate has been altered. A query of the VIN is run in NCIC and the vehicle turns out to be stolen. The individual is arrested and charged with Theft. He is aware the vehicle was stolen because as it turns out, he stole it.

For TIBRS, this will be reported as Stolen Property Offenses (280). In the Property segment, select <u>None</u> as the loss type. The recovery of the vehicle will be reported by the agency that entered the original Motor Vehicle Theft report.

PLEASE NOTE: If the vehicle was originally reported stolen from your jurisdiction, you just need to edit your original entry to reflect the arrest and recovery.


