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Previous Domestic Violence Flags—Victim/Arrestee

After a discussion with CSU staff concerning the new Previous Domestic Violence Flags, we have decided that the most logical way to collect this information is to answer the questions for previous domestic violence victim or arrestee based on the person's entire background – not just between the victim/arrestee in the specific incident.

For example, if a victim has been documented as a victim in a previous domestic incident, the agency will answer "Yes" regardless of whether the arrestee is

the same person in both incidents or not.

Likewise, arrestees will be considered repeat offenders if they have been arrested for a previous domestic incident regardless of whether or not the victim is the same in both incidents.

Please make note in your new Data Collection manuals on pages 38 and 50 that the Previous Domestic Violence Flags are not limited to the victim and/or arrestee's current partner. This change is already reflected in the electronic version of the 11th edition Data

Collection Manual located on the Law Enforcement Only section of the www.tbi.tn.gov website.



Important Note to N-DEx Users

This is an important reminder to all N-DEx users. Please remember that N-DEx is a live system and subject to the FBI's CJIS Security Policy. You should only run information that pertains

to an active investigation. Please see the following examples of misuse of the N-DEx system. You **should not** run curiosity queries on yourself or a family member. Additionally, it is **not** approved for use when conducting employment background checks.

Agencies should also be aware the N-DEx users are required to complete training every two years in order to remain in compliance. Page 2 Crime Statistics Newsletter

Training Tips!

OFFENSE CLASSIFICATIONS:

QUESTION: A man concealed a DVD in a department store and left the store without paying. He returned to the store and asked for a refund for the DVD. He didn't have a receipt, so they gave him a gift card instead. How is this reported to TIBRS? How many incidents? Is it one or two?

ANSWER: It depends on the timing of events. Please see the examples below:

Example 1: If the shoplifter left the store and returned a very short time later (there is no official guideline for this, but we generally recommend 15 minutes or less), it is reported as 1 incident with 2 offenses: Shoplifting (23C, completed) and Fraud (26A).

The Fraud can be attempted or completed, depending on whether or not the store com-

pleted the transaction and gave the offender the gift card. Report the fraud as attempted if they didn't complete the transaction. Report the fraud as *completed* if the transaction was completed.

The property category in the shoplifting incident is Recordings, Audio/Visual (it is not classified as Merchandise). The property category in the fraud incident is Negotiable Instruments. That is because a credit or debit card may only be used by certain authorized persons as part of an account. A gift card can be used by anyone and is payable without restriction.

Example 2: If the shoplifter left the store and returned after a longer period of time, it would be reported as 2 incidents with 1 offense each: The 1st incident is Shoplifting (completed). The 2nd incident is Fraud (26A).



Like in Example 1, the Fraud can be attempted or completed, depending on whether or not the store completed the transaction and gave the offender the gift card. Report the fraud as attempted if they didn't complete the transaction. Report the fraud as completed if the transaction was completed.

The property categories in Example 2 are the same as Example 1.

CSU has a New Name Effective July 1st



As all TIBRS agencies were previously informed, the TBI's Information System's Division has made some organizational changes in 2013. As a result of these changes, the functions of the Crime Statistics Unit, Law Enforcement Support Services, and the TIES Operations have been combined into one section. The name of this newly developed section is the *CJIS Support Center (CSC)*. Under this central umbrella, three teams will support the overall mission of law enforcement agencies with TIES/NCIC/TIBRS across the state. Of the three teams,

Tennessee Information Enforcement System (TIES) will retain the same name. The remaining two teams are the Audit, Compliance, & Training Team (ACTT) and the Data, Analysis, & Reporting Team (DART). Jackie Vandercook will oversee the work of all CJIS Support Center programs. The official name changes will become effective July 1, 2013. We appreciate your support as we transform and identify new ways to improve our efficiency, effectiveness, and quality of services to the law enforcement community across the state.
