Publications CDs Replaced with Secure Website

As mentioned in the September newsletter, TBI will not be sending the 2013 annual crime publications on CD for the first time. All TIBRS reporting agencies will still be able to view the publications prior to public release utilizing a secure website. Agencies will be able to access the documents on using a log-in and password provided by the CJIS Support Center in early 2014.

The employment numbers are included in FBI and TBI publications. To ensure the correct information is submitted, please complete the form online. Classification Questions

CJIS Support Center Staff are always happy to assist your agencies/colleges/universities with classification of offenses. Please remember that we must have the narrative sent to us so we can provide the most accurate classification guidance.



Narratives are Required Information

Just a reminder, we began requiring the entry of narrative information in TnCOP and your vendor RMS several years ago. Compliance with the requirement has been checked as part of the TIBRS audit process for many years. For agencies using TnCOP, the narrative information is submitted to the CRMS and is a very valuable tool to help solve cases. For agencies using vendor RMS products that provide data to the CRMS, the necessity for providing the narrative is equally important. Narratives should provide as much detail about the incident circumstances as possible.

Location Codes

We implemented several new location codes in 2012. Many of them provided much more specific choices when reporting an incident. Please remember that the most descriptive location code should be used. For example, if a shoplifting offense occurs at a department store in a shopping mall, the location code should be reported as 08–Department/Discount Store instead of the less specific code of 55—Shopping Mall. If several offenses of shoplifting occur at a shopping mall and investigation reveals that the offenses were committed by the same offender(s) without separation of time, they could be reported as one incident if the type stores involved would fall under the same specific location type such as Department/Discount Store. If the location type code is different, the offenses should be reported as separate incidents.
