TCA vs. TIBRS

Six Month TIBRS Data Review

We will send data for the time period of January-June 2019 in mid to late July. It is very important that you review any issues that are identified on the sheet accompanying your Crime in Tennessee page. Please pay close attention to any Hate Bias offenses identified with an "unknown" bias. We will also pass along questions from the FBI pertaining to trend changes, data quality, or reasonableness. You are the data owner and responsible for your data submission, updates and edits to correct any and all errors. We only publish what your agency submits; therefore, it's critical that your data is accurate.

Recently, there have been questions regarding the reporting of incidents and TCA. For example, a vehicle is broken into and a purse stolen. The officer will report this as Burglary of a Motor Vehicle under TCA. However, for TIBRS reporting, it is Theft from a Motor Vehicle. TIBRS does not recognize a motor vehicle as a structure (four walls, roof, and a point of entry and must be for human use).

Another example that we have been getting questions about is:

An Arrestee is cited/charged for an assault involving choking. TCA says this is an Aggravated Assault regardless of injury. For TIBRS, it would be reported as a Simple Assault <u>unless</u> there is serious bodily injury or loss of consciousness.

In some instances, TCA and TIBRS are the same. A person breaks into an unoccupied residence and steals jewelry. For both TCA and TIBRS, this is a Burglary/ Breaking & Entering.

Remember what you learned in TIBRS classes (and is on page 3 of the TIBRS Manual, 14th ed.):

TCA is for *charging*. TIBRS is for *reporting*.

As always, please refer to the TIBRS Manual, 14th ed. to help classify incidents. But if you still need additional help, please do not hesitate to contact your auditor!

TIBRS Training Tip

We've recently been asked by several agencies about joyriding and how to classify it for TIBRS. Regardless of the charge, a joyriding or breach of trust involving a motor vehicle would be considered a Motor Vehicle Theft (for TIBRS).

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT (240)

Definition: The theft of a motor vehicle.

A motor vehicle is defined for TIBRS purposes as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on land surface and not on rails and which fits one of the following property descriptions:

- AUTOMOBILES: Sedans, coupes, SUVs, station wagons, convertibles, taxicabs, or other similar motor vehicles, which serve the primary purpose of transporting people.
- BUSES: Motor vehicles that are specifically designed (but not necessarily used) to transport groups of people on a commercial basis.
- **RECREATIONAL VEHICLES:** Motor vehicles that are specifically designed (but not necessarily used) to transport people and also *provide them temporary lodging* for recreational purposes. Conversion vans are considered Recreational Vehicles.
- TRUCKS: Motor vehicles that are specifically designed (but not necessarily used) to transport cargo or other items by a private citizen or on a commercial basis.
- OTHER MOTOR VEHICLES: Any other motor vehicles (motorcycles, motor scooters, trail bikes, mopeds, snowmobiles, golf carts, motorized wheelchairs, etc.) whose primary purpose is to transport people.
- VANS: Motor vehicles designed having a rear door and often have sliding door(s) on one or both sides used for transporting goods or people. Includes mini-vans, panel vans, etc. Does not include conversion vans, which should be entered as Recreational Vehicles.

TIBRS Tip: Classify as Motor Vehicle Theft all cases where vehicles are taken by persons not having lawful access even if the vehicles are later abandoned, including joyriding.

Do not include the taking of a vehicle for temporary use when prior authority has been granted or can be assumed, such as in family situations; or unauthorized use by chauffeurs and others having lawful access to the vehicle. Other Group A offenses may, however, have occurred in these situations. For example, if a chauffeur steals a car entrusted to his care, Embezzlement should be reported.
