



Family Caregiver Support

COVID-19 has been very difficult for many families across Tennessee. That's especially true for families caring for a loved one with disabilities at home. To provide some relief for those families, Tennessee is using federal COVID funding¹ to pay for extra services and supports that will:

- Help people live safely and as independently as possible.
- Provide relief for family caregivers.
- Help people remain in their homes and communities.

These services will be available to persons supported in CHOICES, Employment and Community First CHOICES, or the 1915(c) Waivers operated by DIDD² if they routinely receive support from unpaid family caregivers.³

Here are the kinds of extra services available in each program.



- Respite
- Adult day services
- Assistive technology
- Enabling technology
- Minor home modifications

Employment and Community First CHOICES

- Respite
- Assistive technology, adaptive equipment and supplies
- Enabling technology
- Minor home modifications

1915(c) Waivers

- Respite
- Specialized medical equipment, supplies, and assistive technology
- Enabling technology
- Environmental accessibility modifications

People who qualify can receive up to \$3,000 more of these services from now through March 31, 2024, even if it exceeds service limits, budgets or cost caps.

² Includes the Statewide, Comprehensive Aggregate Cap (CAC) and Self-Determination Waivers. To be eligible, individuals must be enrolled in CHOICES, ECF CHOICES or one of the 1915(c) waiver programs as of July 12, 2021. ³ Individuals receiving residential services do not qualify.
