Ladies and Gentlemen,

Transmitted herewith is the agreed upon procedures for the un-itemized contribution audit of Mr. Louis Oliver's 2014 First Quarter Campaign Financial Disclosure Statement for the 2014 election campaign for the Chancery Court District 18, Division 1. This audit was conducted pursuant to the requirements of T.C.A. §2-10-212.

The audit procedures developed are to aid the Registry of Election Finance in its responsibilities to monitor and enforce Tennessee's Campaign Financial Disclosure Laws and Campaign Contribution Limit Laws. The candidate is responsible for complying with campaign finance laws and the accuracy of campaign financial disclosures. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of the Bureau of Ethics and Campaign Finance's internal audit group. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the agreed upon procedures described in the report for any other purpose than aiding the Registry.

This report is for the information and use of the Members of the Tennessee Registry of Election Finance as outlined; and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than the Registry without understanding the objectives, purposes, and underlying assumptions. This report, however, is a matter of public record.

Louis Oliver III 2014 First Quarter Contribution Audit

AUDIT OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the audit were to determine Mr. Louis Oliver's compliance with certain provisions of campaign finance disclosure laws and regulations; compliance with certain provisions of campaign contribution limit laws and regulations; accuracy and completeness of the un-itemized contribution disclosures on his 2014 First Quarter Campaign Financial Disclosure Statement; and to recommend appropriate actions to correct any deficiencies.

The audit report contains no findings.

AUDIT AUTHORITY

Tennessee Code Annotated (T.C.A.) §§2-10-206 and 2-10-212 authorize the Registry of Election Finance (Registry) to conduct audits of campaign financial disclosure statements filed with the Registry. The audit was initiated based on T.C.A. §2-10-212(i), which requires the Registry to audit any candidate that files a disclosure statement with more than 30% of the candidate's contributions reported as un-itemized contributions and the aggregate un-itemized contributions reported are greater than \$5,000.

AUDIT PURPOSE

The Registry's contribution audits are to assist and encourage candidate compliance with campaign disclosure laws. The audit process assists the Registry in providing timely and accurate campaign information to government officials and the public. The Registry's audits provide a tool to the Registry to evaluate the effectiveness of the campaign financial disclosure process. In addition, the audits assist the Registry with the enforcement of campaign finance limit laws and campaign finance disclosure laws. Finally, the audit reports are prepared to assist the candidate and the State of Tennessee with promoting governmental accountability and integrity.

AUDIT SCOPE

Tennessee's campaign financial disclosure law requires candidates to make biannual financial disclosures as of the date of the first contribution or first expenditure, whichever occurs earlier. The biannual report periods are from January 16 to June 30 and July 1 to January 15 of each year. During an election year, the disclosures expand to quarterly reports, pre-primary reports, and pre-general reports. This audit relates to only disclosure reports that meet the requirements listed in T.C.A. §2-10-212(i). Therefore, the audit reviewed only Mr. Oliver's disclosures on his 2014 First Quarter report.

CAMPAIGN OVERVIEW

CAMPAIGN ORGANIZATION

Mr. Louis Oliver was a candidate in the May 6, 2014 primary election for the Chancery Court for District 18, Division 1. Mr. Oliver filed an Appointment of Political Treasurer Statement with the Registry on December 11, 2013 appointing Robert Jennings as political treasurer.

The candidate's first financial disclosure for the 2014 campaign was the 2013 Year-End Supplemental report filed on January 31, 2014. The candidate's latest financial disclosure report for the 2014 election was the 2014 Pre-Primary report filed on April 29, 2014. The 2014 Pre-Primary report indicated \$8,165.71 cash on hand, no outstanding obligations and no outstanding loans. The candidate has not completed his 2014 election campaign reporting requirements. The candidate's next report will be the 2014 Second Quarter report due July 10, 2014.


OVERVIEW OF FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES

The following financial amounts are a summary of the financial disclosures made by the candidate. 
2014 FIRST QUARTER CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS

OBJECTIVES, METHODOLOGIES, CONCLUSIONS

UN-ITEMIZED CONTRIBUTIONS AND RECEIPTS

Audit Objectives:

The objectives of the audit of un-itemized contributions were to determine whether:

- campaign contributions from individuals and Political Action Committees (PAC) were within limits;
- all contributions were from non-prohibited sources;
- all contributions received were reported, reported in the proper period, reported in compliance with T.C.A. §§2-10-105 and 2-10-107, and reported in compliance with the Registry's rules; and
- all contributions were supported by bank statements and deposit slips.

Audit Methodology:

The Registry obtained Mr. Oliver's 2014 First Quarter Campaign Financial Disclosure Statement to verify that the un-itemized contributions were greater than \$5,000.00 and 30% of the total contributions reported. We requested Mr. Oliver provide supporting documentation for the un-itemized contributions of \$8,998.00 that he reported on his 2014 First Quarter report. The candidate's campaign records included bank statements, deposit slips, copies of checks, contribution lists, reconciliation sheets and electronic contribution transfers. The following steps were performed on Mr. Oliver's campaign documentation:

- The campaign records were reviewed to determine if the candidate's un-itemized contributions received from January 16, 2014 thru March 31, 2014 totaled \$8,998.
- A list of un-itemized contributions was prepared and compared to the candidate's bank statements to determine if the candidate deposited all funds into a campaign bank account and properly recorded the funds.
- A list of un-itemized contributions by contributor was prepared and compared to the candidate's itemized contributions reported during the election to determine if campaign contributions from individuals and PACs complied with campaign contribution limits, T.C.A. §2-10-301, et seq.
- An un-itemized contributions list was reviewed to determine if all contributions were reported, all receipts received were reported, all contributions were reported in the proper period, all contributions were in compliance with T.C.A. §§2-10-105 and 2-10-107, and all contributions were in compliance with the Registry's rules.

Audit Conclusion:

Mr. Oliver's 2014 First Quarter Campaign Financial Disclosure Statement reported unitemized contributions were greater than \$5,000.00 and 30% of the total contributions. The audit indicated all un-itemized contributions reported were deposited into the campaign bank account. The audit indicated the un-itemized contributions complied with campaign finance laws and Registry rules.

REGISTRY OF ELECTION FINANCE ACTIONS

The Members of the Registry of Election Finance reviewed the 2014 contribution audit of Mr. Oliver during the August 13, 2014 regular monthly meeting. The report contained no findings. The Registry voted to accept and approve the audit report with no further action.
