One of the things that we've seen 21 from years past is that blurred line between the 22 word "attendant" and knowing that we have a remote 23 attendant and we have a boiler attendant. And

24 they have different qualifications, but they could 25 also serve both roles as long as they are so

1 qualified.

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MR. BAUGHMAN: Well, even getting 3 down, as we go further and you get to analyzing 4 the 20-minute rule and the lack of some wording

5 that needs to be in there to qualify -- as you 6 said, the opener is the one that qualifies --

7 well, then it gets to be will the owner -- so it's

8 a building, and that building is owned -actually, it's a leased facility and it's owned by

10 a real estate consortium out of Chicago, let's

11 say. So as we qualify the word by the owner, is 12 it the owner of the equipment or is it the owner

13 of the building? Because in a lease facility, the

14 boiler is part of the building itself. So at some

point in time, we can go through and have some

16 more, probably, clarification needed to help in

17 this whole analyzation process.

18 MR. TOTH: Yeah. I don't want to 19 get my hand slapped for interrupting.

20 Great question. The thing is, when

21 we look at it, we look at the rules and

22 regulations, calling it an owner/user, just like 23 the representation. It's the owner/user, owner or

24 user, okay, not an owner/user company. We've had

25 that discussion for about three hours 12 years

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1 ago. We won't do that again.

But it is whoever is not just owning 3 it. Maybe they owned it and operated it, but 4 really it's who is operating it, who has got the

5 ultimate responsibility for it.

So when we look at the 20-minute 7 rule -- and this is where -- this is where we've 8 talked about this for decades about what can we do 9 about boiler operators or what can we do about 10 more qualifications. When I explain it to people, 11 if we require you to go look at that boiler every

12 20 minutes, that can be an individual that is

13 taking a look and taking readings every

14 20 minutes, making sure that the boiler is not

15 about to shake off of its foundation, as long as

16 we're doing it every 20 minutes.

17 When we go into a situation where 18 we're talking about boiler variances and spreading 19 that out for four hours, we need to have some

20 people that are a lot more qualified.

21 And, you know, somebody that does a

22 lot of training as you do, Mr. Baughman, we like 23 to see people more qualified, people come to our

24 classes, and you're, like, wow.

25 MR. BAUGHMAN: And so recently,

Page 167 1 we've run into two boilers that were operating

2 under the variance and both of them had -- one had

3 blown the site glass out of the rear and was

4 throwing heat out and it'd catch on fire, and the

5 other one had blown a gasket on the door, and

6 there again, was throwing that fire and heat right

7 out. And so that whole question came about, and

8 my recommendation to them was, "You've got this

9 four hour, but that doesn't mean you're mandated

10 to check it just once every four hours.

MR. TOTH: That's right. That's 11

12 right. It's a documented check, isn't it?

13 MR. BAUGHMAN: Yes. And so, you

14 know, those are things that -- we never have that

15 discussion because, there again, it's not part of

16 our end of it. But we, as confident boiler people

17 and in the safety end of it, want to have that 18 conversation saying even though this thing is

giving you the mandate that you can check it once

20 every four hours, it's recommended that we check

21 it more often than that.

22 And I know we don't ever really have

23 that discussion because it's not part of this.

24 And although we discuss things that aren't part of

25 this as it is, but I would love to continue that

- 1 mindset of not necessarily checking the boiler
- 2 just once every four hours.

MR. TOTH: And to that, the client

4 out in Chattanooga -- yes, the checklist, the

5 requirements say once every four hours; their

6 choice is to do it once every two hours. That's

7 what they do.

And I encourage this body to continue 9 to recommend that to the people that appear before

10 it. We know it's every four hours. I highly

11 recommend more often than that.

12 MR. BAUGHMAN: Well, you guys came 13 out of a Navy background. And the number of times 14 you check a boiler within that operational period

15 versus what we're doing in the industry -- but I

16 think we're heading in the right direction.

17 MR. TOTH: Thank you for the time. 18 CHAIRMAN MORELOCK: Very good.

19 DR. HARGROVE: I would add that in

20 the context of the different titles, because I was 21 looking at that, the importance of the job

22 description between boiler monitor, the technician

23 and a couple of other different titles that we all

24 saw with regard to, you know boiler operations.

25 So for companies like Neville's and yours, that

- 1 kind of advice to your client is, I think,
- 2 critical for this Board.
