16 bit of 693, the fiscal year of '16-'17, up to 868.

17 Acceptance inspections are about the same way.

18 They're up about 130. That's just new elevators

19 that we accepted through the year. The biannuals

20 are down little a bit, just for the simple fact

21 that we're doing so many acceptance inspections.

22 They take a day, a day and a half to do a

23 brand-new elevator; where a biannual inspection

24 doesn't take as long. So we're spending a little

25 bit more time on the new -- on the growth.

Page 12 MR. RADER: So "acceptance," those 2 are new elevators? MR. FARMER: They're brand-new 4 elevators. Any of the stuff that's listed below. 5 And I kind of broke down the numbers for you of 6 exactly what we inspect and how many there is in 7 the state. Like, passenger elevators, there's 8 13,149; freight elevators is 592; there's 9 350 escalators; 10 moving walks; 257 dumbwaiters; 10 we actually do 1,197 handicap lifts -- which is 11 amazing. I didn't know there was that many --12 aerial lifts and tramways, that's ski lifts over 13 Gatlinburg, there's 10 of them; and introduced to 14 the state a couple years ago was the ski 15 conveyors. Basically, what they are is they're 16 conveyor belts. They run up the side of a 17 mountain. Skiers get on and it pulls them to the 18 top, they jump off, and go back down. So it's a 19 little more -- it's a little faster than the lift 20 type. I think they use them for tubes, too. 21 That's about all I've got. I can 22 entertain any questions. Page 13 1 CHAIRMAN FOX: All right. Thank 2 you very much. MR. FARMER: You're very welcome. 3 CHAIRMAN FOX: Mr. Hardy, I will 4 5 assume you are giving the report on the Amusement 6 Device Unit. 7 MR. HARDY: Yes, sir. I also --8 there's a handout at the table with graphs on it. 9 Our statistics -- I'll talk about our statistics 10 and then a couple of other things. 11 As far as permits issued, you're all 12 aware that we started our new fiscal year on 13 July 1. The Unit has issued 98 permits so far 14 this fiscal year. But we haven't met since we 15 closed out our previous fiscal year, so we ended 16 fiscal year '17-'18 by issuing 408 permits. The 17 year prior to that, we issued 348, so we finished 18 the fiscal year with a 17 percent increase of 19 companies permitted. 20 As far as devices, individual 21 devices, we have permitted 1,133 individual 22 devices thus far this fiscal year. We closed out 23 last fiscal year with 3,582 individual devices 24 permitted. The previous year was 3,126, so we

25 have a 14.6 percent increase, as far as annual

Page 14 1 statistics, closed out '17-'18 versus the previous 2 year. 3 The compliance officer and the 4 administrative staff are responsible for 5 permitting 25 new first-time permits so far this 6 year. We closed out fiscal year '17-'18 by 7 issuing 134 new permits. And the year prior to 8 that, we issued 83 new permits. So as far as our 9 year-ending statistic, that is a 61 percent 10 increase of new companies permitted over fiscal 11 year '16-'17. 12 I'm excited. I think the staff is 13 excited about the remaining fiscal year, 14 optimistic to see what we can get accomplished. 15 We're kind of young into this year, but with the 16 staff, optimistic to see what we can get 17 accomplished this fiscal year and don't anticipate 18 anything but continued growth there. Our goal, 19 again, is by the end of this year, we'll have 20 located, you know, with a few exceptions that we

21 talked about, people dropping off and coming in.

Let everybody see you -- he's been here 20 with us all week, and we've been having some 21 pretty aggressive discussions and trying to get 22 what data we need to collect, and his homework and 23 our homework. But we're well under way with that 24 process, brainstorming, gathering information, and

Chris mentioned that the elevator has 2 completed their process. They're now live with 3 the software. We do anticipate more growing pains 4 as we implement the software, but the rewards of 5 what the new system will give us will be very 6 advantageous. We'll have the capability of 7 tracking renewals, tracking individual devices, 8 and company -- company histories, and also 9 incorporating the online payment system as 10 elevators has done. We think that will be a 11 tremendous help to us. 12 Fair season. Fair season is 13 currently in full swing, maybe on the south side 14 of the bell, but we've made several spot checks on 15 various fairs and festivals within the state. 16 Mainly what we do is verify that the devices from 17 the company's permit match the devices that are 18 operating on site there. 19 All the fairs are important to us. 20 We've tried this year to especially visit and be 21 visible for the big guys. We spent a couple days 22 at the Wilson County Fair and the Tennessee State 23 Fair. I know Kevin has covered the Delta Fair 24 over in West Tennessee.

This year we've also tried to visit

1 the traveling carnivals that are making their 2 first stop in the state. So we think that's 3 important, you know. Number one, they have to be 4 permitted, but number two, we want to get boots on 5 the ground and go out and make absolutely sure that the devices they have set up and operating 7 have been inspected, and they are under their permit umbrella, so... 9 We're just working with the fairs and 10 carnival companies to ensure everything is acceptable in accordance to the law. And fair 12 season does end with the Franklin County Fair that begins on October 10th, is the last one as far as 13 14 the Tennessee Association of Fairs lists. 15 We stay mindful of the urgency of 16 issuing these permit renewals prior to the fairs 17 operating in order to avoid backlogs. The staff 18 continues to do a very good job staying on top of 19 these renewals. And we're going to do whatever is 20 necessary on our end to ensure that these 21 companies that are playing these fairs and 22 festivals are permitted before they operate. 23 Does anyone have any questions for me
