10	ordered them back to the 20-minute rule, which	01:4
11	this individual company has informed me that they	
12	are on the 20-minute rule at this time. And I	
13	think that's where they're kind of in a pickle.	
1 4	And they put themselves in that pickle, as	
15	Mr. Chapman alluded to. The letter specifically	01:4
16	states that even back in during that time, five	
1 7	years ago, it explains to them very clearly what	
18	the requirements were. So I'm going to	
19	communicate that to them.	
20	CHAIRMAN MORELOCK: Sam, you need	01:4
21	to unmute. We can't hear you.	
22	MR. CHAPMAN: Okay. What I was	
2 3	going to say on that is normally when the variance
