We've got 15 elevators that were accepted under a 1996 code, 16 which just calls for a two-way communication 17 inside the elevator to an outside source. And 18 then as it moves up through the years, the 19 requirements have become more stringent. Presently, the 2010 code requires 21 communication outside the elevator that is 22 utilized by pushing a button on the elevator. It 23 calls a 24-hour answering service. It will state 24 the location of the elevator and the number of the 25 elevator.

2 the building owner's responsibility to inspect the 3 elevator phones monthly and to keep a log on-site, 4 stating that they have tested the phones. This is 5 to help -- we come every six months. We may come 6 in and a phone works, and then two weeks later the phone may go out.
