Labor Force and Nonfarm Employment 2011-2015

The Bureau of Labor Statistics has two cooperating agreements with states to collect employment levels and unemployment data for states and sub-state areas. The Current Employment Statistics (CES) program samples 143,000 businesses on a monthly basis finding their monthly employment, hours, and earnings for the pay period that includes the week of the 12th of each month. This data is solicited using a computer assisted telephone interview. The result is monthly non-agricultural employment estimates. These estimates provide total employment, by industry, for the state and MSAs. The data is compiled based on the employee's place of work.

The second cooperative agreement is the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program. The source data is obtained by the Bureau of the Census using a monthly survey of about 60,000 households. The data collected from this survey includes the number of persons who are currently working and/or unemployed and available to work. The results are an estimate of total employment and the unemployment in the U.S., states, and sub-states areas. For the LAUS program the data is compiled based on the employee's county of residence. This is the difference in the employment count from the non-agricultural data.

The monthly data for both programs are updated and revised to produce annual averages at the end of each year. Pages 2 and 3 of this edition show the annual averages for Tennessee and the seven largest MSAs.

In Tennessee

The non-agricultural employment gives users a window into growth and declining industries. From 2011 until 2015, the total non-agricultural employment in Tennessee increased by 230,500 jobs (8.7 percent). The Nashville MSA accounted for 54.7 percent of that growth (126,000 jobs). The Tennessee industries with the largest growth were professional and business services sector (up 69,800 jobs, 21.6 percent increase) and leisure and hospitality (up 40,300 jobs, 15.9 percent increase).

Professional and business services include

temporary help services; legal and tax services; banking and collection; all computer services, except sales; management and consulting; and waste management. Leisure and hospitality includes performing arts; sports; museums; gambling; recreation; hotels and motels; as well as all restaurants and drinking establishments. Since 2011 these two industries combined for an increase of 110,100 jobs or 47.8 percent of the Tennessee growth. A majority of the 40,300 job increase in the leisure and hospitality sector occurred in food services and drinking establishments (up 33,800 jobs). Total government employment declined by 3,900 jobs from 2011 to 2015.

The unemployment rate in Tennessee has gone down each year since 2011. In 2011 it was 9 percent and by 2015 it was 5.8 percent. During that time there was a decline of 103,800 unemployed people.

In the Metropolitan Areas

From 2011 until 2015, the total nonagricultural employment in the ten metro areas increased by 209,000 jobs (seven MSAs are on pages 2-3). The job growth in these metropolitan areas encompass 42 Tennessee counties and 11 out-of-state counties. The remaining 53 non-metropolitan counties increased by 29,680 jobs (15 of these counties declined). During that time period, the Nashville MSA increased by 16 percent while Obion County decreased by 9.9 percent. All of the large MSAs had an increase of nonagricultural employment over time.

The annual average unemployment rate decreased or remained from the previous year in all seven MSAs. The only exception was a 0.1 percent increase in Knoxville during 2013. During that year, the labor force and employment declined while the total number of unemployed people remained unchanged from the previous year.

The Memphis MSA had the highest unemployment rate and the Nashville MSA had the lowest unemployment rate in both 2011 and 2015. Memphis started at 9.4 percent and ended in 2015 at 6.5 percent. Nashville started at 7.8 percent and ended in 2015 at 4.6 percent.



NONFARM EMPLOYMENT & LABOR FORCE NARRATIVE

Total nonfarm employment increased by 80,600 jobs from April 2015 to April 2016. There were large increases in professional/business services (up 14,200 jobs), which includes an increase of 8,400 jobs in administrative/support/waste management; health care/social assistance (up 12,700 jobs), which includes increases of 7,700 jobs in ambulatory health care services and 4,600 jobs in hospitals; and retail trade (up 11,100 jobs), which includes increases of 2,600 jobs in motor vehicle/parts dealers and 2,400 jobs in food/beverage stores.

Smaller increases occurred in construction (up 5,900 jobs), which includes increases of 2,200 jobs in specialty trade contractors and 2,000 jobs in heavy/civil engineering construction; wholesale trade (up 5,700 jobs), which includes increases of 2.000 jobs in durable goods and 1,900 jobs in nondurable goods wholesalers; food services/drinking places (up 5,600 jobs); transportation equipment manufacturing (up 5,200 jobs); educational services (up 3,900 jobs); financial activities (up 3,700 jobs), which includes an increase of 2,900 jobs in finance/ insurance; and transportation/warehousing (up 3,700 jobs). This was partially offset by a decline of 1,000 jobs in local government educational services

During April 2016, nonfarm employment increased by 21,000 jobs. There were increases in food services/drinking places (up 6,600 jobs), administrative/support/waste management (up 5,500 jobs), arts/entertainment/recreation (up 3,200 jobs), retail trade (up 2,000 jobs), and wholesale trade, educational services, and other services (each up 1,300 jobs). This was partially offset by a decline in specialty trade contractors (down 1,200 jobs).

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted estimated unemployment rate for April 2016 was 4.3 percent, down 0.2 percentage point from the revised March 2016 rate. The United States unemployment rate in April was 5 percent, unchanged from the revised March 2016 rate.

In April 2015, the U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.4 percent while the state rate was 5.9 percent.

Across Tennessee, the unemployment rate decreased in 90 counties, increased in Jackson and Meigs counties, and remained the same in three counties. Thirty-three counties had a rate lower than 5 percent. In April 2016, the lowest rate was in Williamson County at 2.7 percent, down 0.1 percent from the previous month, while the highest rate was in Houston County at 6.8 percent, down from 7.3 percent in March.

The data from all the nonfarm employment estimates tables include all full- and part-time nonfarm wage and salary employees who worked during or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. This is a count of jobs by place of work. Agricultural workers, proprietors, self-employed persons, workers in private households, and unpaid family workers are excluded. These numbers may not add due to rounding. Data are based on the 2015 benchmark.






Total nonfarm employment increased by 2,800 jobs from March 2016 to April 2016. There were increases in leisure/hospitality (up 1,300 jobs), state government (up 500 jobs), retail trade (up 400 jobs), and durable goods manufacturing, local government, and professional/business services (each up 200 jobs). This was partially offset by decreases of 200 jobs in both mining/logging/construction and financial activities.

Over the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 10,300 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 3,400 jobs, while service-providing jobs increased by 6,900.



Total nonfarm employment increased by 5,700 jobs from March 2016 to April 2016. There were increases in administrative/support/waste management (up 3,100 jobs), retail trade (up 1,700 jobs), leisure/hospitality (up 1,500 jobs), durable goods manufacturing (up 600 jobs), wholesale trade (up 500 jobs), and nondurable goods manufacturing and other services (both up 300 jobs). These increases were partially offset by declines in educational/health services (down 700 jobs); transportation/warehousing/utilities and local government (both down 600 jobs); and financial activities (down 500 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 12,000 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 600, while service-providing jobs increased by 11,400.

Total nonfarm employment increased by 6,500 jobs from March 2016 to April 2016. There were increases in leisure/hospitality (up 4,100 jobs); administrative/support/waste management (up 1,100 jobs); durable goods manufacturing (up 800 jobs); educational/health services (up 700 jobs), which includes an increase of 500 jobs in educational services; mining/logging/construction and financial assistance (both up 300 jobs); and local government (up 200 jobs). This was partially offset by declines in professional/scientific/technical services (down 1,100 jobs) and retail trade (down 200 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 29,400 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 5,900, while service-providing increased by 23,500.
