The Labor Market Report

Labor Force and Nonfarm Employment, 2013-2017

The Bureau of Labor Statistics has two cooperating agreements with states to estimate employment and unemployment levels for states and sub-state areas. The Current Employment Statistics (CES) program surveys 149,000 businesses on a monthly basis to find their monthly employment, hours, and earnings for the pay period that includes the 12th of each month. This data is solicited using a computer assisted telephone interview. The result is monthly non-agricultural employment estimates. These estimates provide total employment, by industry, for the state and metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs). This data is compiled based on the employee's place of work.

The second cooperative agreement is the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program. The Bureau of the Census obtains the source data using a monthly phone survey of about 60,000 households. The data collected from this survey includes the number of persons who are currently working and/or unemployed and available to work. The results are the total employment and the unemployment percentages in the U.S., states, and sub-states areas. For the LAUS program the data is compiled based on the employee's place of residence. This is a major difference in the employment count from the non-agricultural data.

The monthly data for both programs are updated and revised to produce annual averages at the end of each year. Pages 2 and 3 of this edition show the annual averages for Tennessee and the seven largest MSAs.

In Tennessee

The non-agricultural employment gives users a window into growing and declining industries. From 2013 until 2017 the total nonagricultural employment in Tennessee increased by 250,000 jobs (9.1 percent). In the previous year (2016-2017) the nonagricultural employment increased by 64,100

jobs. During the entire time period, the Nashville MSA accounted for 53.6 percent of the total state growth (133,900 jobs) but only 32.6 percent of the total Tennessee employment. The four largest MSAs increased by 212,600 jobs.

The Tennessee industries with the largest growth, from 2013-2017, were professional and business services (up 52,100 jobs or 14.7 percent) and leisure and hospitality (up 43,900 jobs or 15.4 percent). Mining, logging, and construction increased 14.9 percent (or 16,100 jobs).

During the entire period, the unemployment rate decreased every year, in every area in Tennessee. From 2013 through 2017 employment increased in every year except for declines in every MSA in 2014. The exceptions were in the Kingsport-Bristol MSA where the employment declined in both 2014 and 2015 and in the Nashville-Davidson-Murfreesboro-Franklin MSA where employment increased each year. In 2013, the MSAs with the highest and lowest unemployment rates were Memphis (8.5 percent) and Nashville (6.2 percent). In 2017, these areas were Clarksville-Hopkinsville (4.6 percent) and Nashville (2.9 percent).

Compared to the U.S.

The annual average unemployment rate in the U.S. was 7.4 percent (in 2013); 6.2 percent (in 2014); 5.3 percent (in 2015); 4.9 percent (in 2016); and 4.4 percent (in 2017). Tennessee had a lower unemployment rate than the national average in 2016 and 2017. During this time period, Hawaii had the lowest unemployment rate in 2017 (2.4 percent). Nevada had the highest unemployment rate in 2013 (9.6 percent). Hawaii had the lowest unemployment rate and Alaska had the highest unemployment rate in both 2016 and 2017.



NONFARM EMPLOYMENT & LABOR FORCE NARRATIVE

Total nonfarm employment increased by 46,600 jobs from April 2017 to April 2018. There were large increases in accommodation/food services (up 13,100 jobs), which includes an increase of 12,000 jobs in food services/drinking places; professional/business services (up 8,200 jobs), which includes increases of 3,700 jobs in professional/scientific/technical services, 2,500 jobs in administrative/support/waste management, and 2,000 jobs in management of companies/enterprises; transportation/ warehousing (up 7,900 jobs); and health care/social assistance (up 5,500 jobs), which includes increases of 3,100 jobs in hospitals and 1,200 jobs in ambulatory health care services. There were smaller increases in financial activities (up 2,700 jobs), which includes an increase of 1,400 jobs in real estate/rental/ leasing; local government (up 1,900 jobs); construction (up 1,800 jobs), which includes an increase of 2,000 jobs in specialty trade contractors and a decrease of 1,200 jobs in heavy/civil engineering construction; and information (up 1,400 jobs). These increases were partially offset by declines of 2,100 jobs in retail trade, which includes a decrease of 1,500 jobs in food/beverage stores; and a decrease of 1,100 jobs in transportation/equipment manufacturing.

During the past month, nonfarm employment increased by 16,500 jobs. There were increases in food services/drinking places (up 4,900 jobs); professional/business services (up 3,800 jobs), which includes an increase of 2,600 jobs in administrative/support/waste management; arts/entertainment/recreation (up 2,600 jobs); construction (up 2,100 jobs), which includes an increase of 1,000 jobs in heavy/civil engineering construction; and retail trade (up 1,700 jobs). These increases were partially offset by a decline in health care/social assistance (down 1,400 jobs), which includes a drop of 1,100 jobs in ambulatory health care services.

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted estimated unemployment rate for April 2018 was 3.4 percent, unchanged from the revised March rate. The United States unemployment rate for April 2018 was 3.9 percent, down 0.2 percentage point from March. In April 2017, the U.S. seasonally adjusted rate was 4.4 percent while the state rate was 4.0 percent. This is the 16th consecutive month that the Tennessee rate was lower than the national rate.

The not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased in all 95 counties. The largest monthly decline was in Decatur County, down 1.4 percentage point. Williamson County had the lowest rate at 2.0 percent, down 0.4 percentage point. The highest rate was Houston County at 5.0 percent, down from 5.9 percent in March 2018.

The data from all the nonfarm employment estimates tables include all full- and part-time nonfarm wage and salary employees who worked during or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. 

Total nonfarm employment increased by 3,200 jobs from March 2018 to April 2018. There were increases in leisure/hospitality (up 1,400 jobs), education/health services (up 500 jobs), retail trade (up 400 jobs), and professional/business services, durable goods manufacturing, and mining/logging/construction (each up 200 jobs). There were no industries that declined.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 7,600 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs increased by 2,000 while service-providing jobs increased by 5,600.





Total nonfarm employment in Knoxville decreased by 200 jobs from March 2018 to April 2018. There were declines in educational/health services (down 1,200 jobs), durable goods manufacturing (down 400 jobs), and local government and (down 300 jobs). This was partially offset by increases of 1,100 jobs in leisure/hospitality, 400 jobs in professional/business services, and 300 jobs in retail trade.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 700 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs increased by 3,000 while service providing jobs decreased by 2,300.


Total nonfarm employment declined by 700 jobs from March 2018 to April 2018. There were decreases in educational/health services (down 1,200 jobs); transportation/warehousing/utilities (down 900 jobs); wholesale trade and professional/scientific/technical services (both down 400 jobs); and other services (down 200 jobs).

This was partially offset by increases of 800 jobs in retail trade; 700 jobs in mining/logging/construction; 400 jobs in leisure/hospitality; 200 jobs in both durable and nondurable goods manufacturing; and 200 jobs in administrative/support/waste management.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 9,300 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 1,900, while service-providing jobs increased by 7,400 jobs.

(NOT SEASONALLY ADJUSTED)





Total nonfarm employment increased by 5,700 jobs from March 2018 to April 2018. There were increases in professional/business services (up 3,900), which includes increases of 1,900 jobs in professional/scientific/technical and 1,800 jobs in administrative/support/waste management; other services (up 500 jobs); retail trade and educational/health services (both up 400 jobs); mining/logging/construction (up 300 jobs); leisure/hospitality and nondurable goods manufacturing (both up 200 jobs).

These increases were partially offset by declines of 500 jobs in wholesale trade and 200 jobs in local government.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 22,300 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs decreased by 4,200, while service-providing jobs increased by 26,500.
