Goods-Producing & Service-Providing Employment

The Bureau of Labor Statistics segments the economy into various industrial divisions. Among the broadest segments are private sector goods-producing and private sector service-providing. Another segment is government, or the public sector, but the private sector is the tangible driver of an economy. Therefore, it is informative to isolate the private sector.

The goods-producing segment features the production of physical goods. This includes industries such as mining; construction; and manufacturing. The serviceproviding segment does not produce physical goods but instead provides services to consumers or businesses within the economy. This includes industries such as wholesale trade; retail trade; transportation and warehousing; information; finance, insurance, real estate, rental and leasing; professional and business services; educational services, health care, and social assistance; arts, entertainment, recreational, accommodation, and food services; and other services (except public administration).

The Growing Service Sector

In the early 20th century, a majority of workers in the United States were employed in the goods-producing sectors. During the 1920s, agriculture and manufacturing employed more than 55 percent of all U.S. workers. However, the serviceproviding sector had a larger growth rate than the goods-producing sector in the decades that followed. By the middle of the 20th century a majority of workers were employed in the service-providing sector. In 2019, 84.3 percent of all nonfarm workers in Tennessee were employed in a service-providing industry compared to 86.0 percent for the United States.

In Tennessee, the goods-providing sector declined by 18.5 percent from 1990 to 2019 while the service-providing sector increased by 65.2 percent over the same time period. By comparison, the goods-producing sector in the United States de-

clined by 11.2 percent from 1990 to 2019 while the service-providing sector increased by 51.4 percent over the same time period.

Industry Subsectors

Within the goods-producing sectors, the manufacturing sector employed the largest share of both Tennessee and U.S. workers in 2019. Looking at 1990, the manufacturing sector employed 22.7 percent of all nonfarm employees in Tennessee and 16.2 percent in the United States. By 2019, manufacturing only made-up 11.4 percent of all nonfarm employees and only 8.5 percent in the United States.

The largest service-providing sectors in Tennessee and the United States during 1990 was the trade, transportation, and utilities sector. It accounted for 22.0 percent of all nonfarm employment in Tennessee and 20.7 percent of all nonfarm employment in the United States. By 2019, trade, transportation, and utilities accounted for 20.5 percent of all nonfarm employment in Tennessee while in the United States it accounted for only 18.4 percent of the total nonfarm employment.

Conclusion


Not only did employment growth in the service-providing sector outperform that of the goods-producing sector during the 1990s, it also outperformed in the years following the 2007-2009 recession. As of 2019, employment in the goods-producing sector was still below pre-recession levels in 2007 for both Tennessee and the United States. On the other hand, the service-providing sector has performed better and is up 15.4 percent in Tennessee since 2007. Service-providing in the United States is up 12.2 percent from 2007.

As of a result from the COVID-19 pandemic, goods-producing is down 5.7 percent in Tennessee while private-service providing is down 4.3 percent. The next two pages show the changes in both Tennessee and the United States from 1990 to 2019.

Tennessee Industry Employment, 1990-2019







Nonfarm Employment & Labor Workforce Narrative

Total nonfarm employment decreased by 148,400 jobs from August 2019 to August 2020. There were decreases in leisure & hospitality (down 58,200 jobs), which includes decreases of 32,600 jobs in food services & drinking places; manufacturing (down 32,100 jobs), which includes decreases of 27,400 jobs in transportation equipment manufacturing; professional & business services (down 19,900 jobs), which includes decreases of 17,000 jobs in administrative/support/waste management; health care & social assistance (down 14,500 jobs), which includes decreases of 5,800 jobs in ambulatory health care services; local government (down 13,700 jobs); clothing & clothing accessories stores (down 8,000 jobs).

These decreases were partially offset by increases in general merchandise stores (up 7,700 jobs); federal government (up 5,100 jobs).

During the past month, nonfarm employment increased by 37,900 jobs. There were increases in government (up 22,000 jobs), which includes increases of 17,000 jobs in local government educational services; professional & business services (up 12,800 jobs), which includes increases of 12,100 jobs in administrative/support/waste management.

These increases were partially offset by decreases in leisure & hospitality (down 4,900 jobs), which includes decreases of 2,500 jobs in arts/entertainment/recreation; construction (down 2,900 jobs).

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted estimated unemployment rate for August 2020 was 8.5 percent, down from the revised July 2020 rate of 9.7 percent. The United States unemployment rate for August 2020 was 8.4 percent, down from the revised July 2020 rate of 10.2 percent. In August 2019, the U.S. seasonally adjusted rate was 3.7 percent while the state rate was 3.4 percent.

The not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased in 94 counties and increased in 1 county. No county had their unemployment rate remain the same over the month. Moore County had the lowest rate at 5.1 percent, down from the revised July rate of 6.4 percent. The highest rate was Shelby County at 13.4 percent, down from the revised unemployment rate of 14.8 percent in July.

The data from all the nonfarm employment estimates tables include all full- and part-time nonfarm wage and salary employees who worked during or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. This is a count of jobs by place of work. Agricultural workers, proprietors, self-employed persons, workers in private households, and unpaid family workers are excluded. 

Chattanooga MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Chattanooga MSA increased by 500 jobs from July 2020 to August 2020. There was an increase in education & health services (up 700 jobs); trade/transportation/utilities (up 600 jobs) which includes increase of 400 jobs in retail trade; federal government (500 jobs); manufacturing (up 200 jobs). This increase was partially offset by a decrease of 800 jobs in local government.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 3,900 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs decreased by 1,400 jobs while service-providing jobs decreased by 2,500 jobs.

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
Knoxville MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Knoxville MSA increased by 4,400 jobs from July 2020 to August 2020. There were increases in government (up 2,000 jobs); professional & business services (up 800 jobs); trade/transportation/utilities (up 700 jobs); manufacturing (up 600 jobs), which includes increase of 500 jobs in durable goods manufacturing.

These increases were partially offset by a decrease of 600 jobs in leisure & hospitality.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 11,800 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs decreased by 1,900 jobs while service-providing jobs decreased by 9,900 jobs.


Memphis MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Memphis MSA increased by 8,500 jobs from July 2020 to August 2020. There were increases in government (up 5,700 jobs), which includes increases of 4,800 jobs in local government; administrative/support/waste management (up 3,000 jobs); leisure & hospitality (up 700 jobs).

These increases were partially offset by decreases in transportation/warehousing/utilities and wholesale trade (both down 800 jobs); manufacturing (down 600 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 37,800 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs decreased by 6,300 jobs, while service-providing jobs decreased by 31,500 jobs.


Nashville MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Nashville MSA increased by 17,000 jobs from July 2020 to August 2020. There were increases in government (up 9,400 jobs), which includes increases of 8,000 jobs in local government; professional & business services (up 5,800 jobs), which includes increases of 4,900 jobs administrative/support/waste management; educational & health services (up 2,700 jobs).

These increases were partially offset by decreases in leisure & hospitality (down 3,100 jobs); retail trade (down 300 jobs); durable goods manufacturing (down 200 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 64,600 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs decreased by 15,000 jobs, while service-providing decreased by 49,600 jobs.
