The unemployment rate measures the percentage of those within the labor force that do not currently have a job. To be considered unemployed one has to be available to work, able to work, and actively searching for work. The unemployment rate does not consider discouraged workers, those who are unemployed but have stopped actively searching for work.

The unemployment rate is calculated as: (Unemployed $\div$ Labor Force) $\times 100$.

The participation rate and the unemployment rate are not the only factors used to determine the status of the job market. Another statistic is the employ-ment-population ratio. This ratio represents the number of employed people as a percentage of the civilian noninstitutional population.

The employment-population ratio is calculated as: (Employed $\div$ Civilian Noninstitutional Population) $\times 100$.

Starting with this month's article of the Labor Market Report, the labor force participation Rate and the employmentpopulation ratio will be reported for each month. More data on these rates can be found on pages 2 and 3 of this report.
workers losing their jobs to outsourcing and automation.

There are several different measures in determining the health of the U.S. job market. The two major criteria used in determining the job market's current status is the labor force participation rate and the unemployment rate.

In order for a citizen to be considered a member of the labor force, he or she needs to either have a job or be actively searching for a job. The labor force participation rate is the percentage of those over the age of 16, not including active-duty military personnel and those who are incarcerated or otherwise institutionalized, who are members of the labor force.

The labor force participation rate is calculated as: (Labor Force $\div$ Civilian Noninstitutional Population) $\times 100$.

Since the turn of the century, the labor force participation rate has seen a decline. In 2000, the rate was 67 percent, but by early 2019 the rate had fallen to 63.2 percent. Several economists have argued that the labor force decline may be a result of low-skilled

## Nonfarm Employment \& Labor Workforce Narrative

Total nonfarm employment increased by 49,600 jobs from December 2018 to December 2019. There were increases in leisure \& hospitality services (up 17,000 jobs), which includes increases of 9,100 jobs in accommodation \& food services; trade/transportation/utilities (up 8,200 jobs); professional \& business services (up 7,600 jobs), which includes 5,000 jobs in professional/scientific/technical services; manufacturing (up 5,800 jobs), which includes 3,900 jobs in nondurable goods manufacturing; educational \& health services (up 5,600 jobs), which includes increases of 5,200 jobs in health care \& social assistance; financial activities (up 3,600 jobs), which includes increases of 3,400 jobs in finance \& insurance.

These increases were partially offset by a decrease in specialty trade contractors (down 4,100 jobs) and merchant wholesalers, nondurable goods (down 1,500 jobs).

During the past month, nonfarm employment decreased by 9,400 jobs. There were decreases in state government educational services (down 5,200 jobs); leisure \& hospitality services (down 2,600 jobs), which includes decreases of 2,000 jobs in arts/entertainment/recreation; educational \& health services (down 2,200 jobs), which includes decreases of 1,700 jobs in educational services.

These decreases were partially offset by increases in trade/transportation/utilities (up 2,600 jobs), which includes an increase of 1,300 jobs in transportation \& warehousing.

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted estimated unemployment rate for December 2019 was 3.3 percent, unchanged from the revised November 2019 rate. The United States unemployment rate for December 2019 was 3.5 percent, unchanged from the revised November 2019 rate. In December 2018, the U.S. seasonally adjusted rate was 3.9 percent while the state rate was 3.3 percent.

The not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased in 12 counties, increased in 55 counties, and remained the same in 28 counties. Williamson County had the lowest rate at 2.2 percent, which is unchanged from November. The highest rate was Lincoln County at 6.2 percent, up from 4.4 percent in November.

The data from all the nonfarm employment estimates tables include all full- and part-time nonfarm wage and salary employees who worked during or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. This is a count of jobs by place of work. Agricultural workers, proprietors, selfemployed persons, workers in private households, and unpaid family workers are excluded. These numbers may not add due to rounding. Data are based on the 2018 benchmark.

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## Chattanooga MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Chattanooga MSA decreased by 2,200 jobs from November 2019 to December 2019. There was a decrease in government (down 900 jobs), which includes a decrease of 800 jobs in state government; leisure \& hospitality (down 700 jobs). This decrease was partially offset by increases of 200 jobs in manufacturing and 100 jobs in financial activities.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 3,700 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs increased by 1,400 jobs while serviceproviding jobs increased by 2,300 jobs.

## Knoxville MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Knoxville MSA decreased by 2,600 jobs from November 2019 to December 2019. There were decreases in government (down 1,700 jobs), which includes a decrease of 1,600 jobs in state government; retail trade down 500 jobs.

These decreases were partially offset by an increase of 400 jobs in educational \& health series, and 200 jobs in transportation/ warehousing/utilities.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 7,000 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs increased by 100 jobs while service-providing jobs increased by 6,900 jobs.

## Memphis MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Memphis MSA decreased by 2,900 jobs from November 2019 to December 2019. There were decreases in state government (down 1,500 jobs), leisure \& hospitality services (down 400 jobs), and transportation/warehousing/utilities (down 300 jobs).

This was partially offset by increases in retail trade and professional \& business services (both up 300 jobs), and wholesale trade and professional/scientific/ technical services (both up 200 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment decreased by 600 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs decreased by 1,100 jobs, while serviceproviding jobs increased by 500 jobs.

## Nashville MSA

Total nonfarm employment in the Nashville MSA decreased by 1,900 jobs from November 2019 to December 2019. There were decreases in leisure \& hospitality services (down 1,900 jobs), educational \& health services (down 1,300 jobs), other services (down 1,100 jobs), and information (down 400 jobs).

These decreases were partially offset by increases in trade/transportation/utilities (up 2,300 jobs), which includes an increase of 1,000 jobs in transportation/warehousing/ utilities; and professional \& business services (up 700 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 17,900 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs decreased by 1,600 jobs, while service-providing increased by 19,500 jobs.
