Labor Surplus Areas — FY 2023

A Labor Surplus Area (LSA) is a civil jurisdiction that has a civilian average annual unemployment rate during the previous two calendar years of 20 percent or more above the average annual civilian unemployment rate for all states and Puerto Rico during the same 24-month reference period. The reference period used in preparing the current list was January 2020 through December 2021. The national average unemployment rate during this period was rounded to 6.71 percent. Twenty percent higher than the national unemployment rate is rounded to 8.05 percent. The official unemployment estimates provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics are used in making these classifications. The LSA classification criteria stipulate a civil jurisdiction must have a "floor unemployment rate" of 6 percent or higher to be classified as a LSA. Any civil jurisdiction that has a "ceiling unemployment rate" of 10 percent or higher is classified as a LSA.

Employers in these LSAs may be given preference in bidding on federal procurement contracts. The purpose in providing such preference is to help direct government dollars into areas where people are in the most severe economic need.

Exceptional Circumstances

The classification procedures also provide criteria for the designation of LSAs under exceptional circumstances criteria. These procedures permit the regular classification criteria to be waived when an area experiences a significant increase in unemployment which is not temporary or seasonal and which was not reflected in the data for the 2-year reference period. Under the program's exceptional circumstance procedures, LSA classifications can be made for civil jurisdictions, Metropolitan Statistical Areas or Combined Statistical Areas, as defined by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget.

In order for an area to be classified as a LSA under the exceptional circumstance criteria, the state workforce agency must submit a petition requesting such classifi-

cation to the Department of Labor's Employment & Training Administration (ETA). The current criteria for an exceptional circumstance classification are that an area's unemployment rate is at least 6 percent for each of the three most recent months and projected to be at least 6 percent for each of the next 12 months because of an event.

What are Civil Jurisdictions?

- 1. A city of at least 25,000 population on the basis of the most recently available estimates from the Bureau of the Census; or
- 2. A town or township in the States of Michigan, New Jersey, New York, or Pennsylvania of 25,000 or more population and which possess powers and functions similar to those of cities; or
- 3. All counties, except for those counties which contain any type of civil jurisdictions defined in "1" or "2" above; or
- A "balance of county" consisting of a county less any component cities and townships identified in "1" or "2" above; or
- 5. A county equivalent which is a town in the States of Connecticut, Massachusetts, and Rhode Island, or a municipio in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.

For Fiscal Year 2023, the following areas qualified as Labor Surplus Areas in Tennessee:


