Tennessee Short Term Job Outlook to 2024

From a base of 3.39 million jobs in 2022, total employment for Tennessee, including agricultural, selfemployed, and private household workers is expected to grow to 3.55 million by 2024. Tennessee's postpandemic economic outlook is expected to continue expansion in ten of twelve major industry sectors. There are only two major industry sectors that are projected to have negative annual industry growth for the year 2024 - retail trade and administrative and support and waste management and remediation services. The health care and social assistance industry is expected to have the largest employment by 2024.

Growing Industries

The most rapidly growing industry sector in Tennessee is expected to be arts, entertainment, and recreation, with a projected total growth of 15.54% over the two-year period. The next highest growth rates are forecast to be the information (15.43%), finance and insurance (15.34%); real estate, rental and leasing (10.26%), and accommodation and food services (9.92%) industries. Many of these industries have experienced these higher growth rates as they recover from the pandemic. Although accommodation and food services lost 48,660 jobs from 2019-2020, its recovery will extend through the year 2024 as its continued growth will see it become the 4th largest industry in Tennessee.

Retail in Decline

With the expansion of e-commerce into the next decade, the retail industry is forecast to continue its downward trend. Many influential retailers continue to shift to an e-commerce-based model, as consumers seem to

prefer this convenience to which they were exposed during the pandemic. This shift to ecommerce is expected to continue into 2024 with numerous retailers closing their brick-and-mortar stores.


Retailers have long depended on the increase of e-commerce for their business profitability. However, many retailers have cited the current inflation as a reason for rethinking their ecommerce strategy. Another reason that has been provided by retailers for this downward trend in e-commerce employment is the residual effect of the layoffs in the technology sector. Many technology companies that were born during the early pandemic boom, had to cease operations and layoff personnel. These technology layoffs caused many companies to reduce their personnel significantly. These shifts in strategies have resulted in leading retailers reducing their ecommerce workforce.


Growing Occupations

The office and administrative support and food preparation and related occupations are projected to have the most job openings by 2024. The transportation and material moving group is projected to have the third largest number of openings, although they do not show the most growth, as the manufacturing sector remains the second largest industry in Tennessee. Computer and mathematical occupations ae expected to be the fastest-growing group; protective services occupations will grow nearly as rapidly.

Projected Industry Growth in Tennessee









Tennessee Civilian Labor Workforce 1993-Present


